Policy on NIH PubMed Central Deposits

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Basically, it says that the APA journals will deposit authors' manuscripts (not the "published" version) on behalf of the authors, if the authors fill out and submit the form (attached).

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This notice provides important information about the NIH PubMed Central deposit request as it relates to articles published in APA journals.

The Policy on Enhancing Public Access to Archived Publications Resulting from NIH-Funded Research, notice number NOT-OD-05-022, was released on February 3, 2005 and took effect May 2, 2005. By this policy, NIH funded investigators are encouraged to deposit to PubMed Central (PMC) an electronic version of the final accepted manuscript within 12 months of publishers' final publication date.

Deposit to PubMed is voluntary. There has been some confusion in the research community that the NIH request is mandatory. This is incorrect. NIH officials have repeatedly stated that authors' participation is *voluntary* and that there will be no sanctions of any kind against authors who choose not to submit their manuscripts.

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
