SAC Considers HR Evaluation Forms

The Staff Advisory Committee (SAC) met on August 29, with all members present! John Dillingham came as our guest representing Human Resources (HR) to help us more thoroughly understand the evaluation process.

Samples of evaluation forms used at three other universities were provided by Mike Livingston for our review. John gave a brief history of the current evaluation process and mentioned that IANR has another form, which our department does not use that he will provide for our review. He also mentioned that IANR is in the midst of redesigning the evaluation process and forms, but that is not expected to be completed for three to five years. Lengthy discussion was held about the forms and other concerns surrounding the evaluation process and ways to make it fair and equitable. Even within our department, multiple forms are being used. SAC members are going to review the forms provided and the IANR form and come to the next meeting ready for further discussion.

Susan Thomas brought a listing of many awards that are available for employees, including a list showing which departmental employees have received these awards in the past. She will be providing brief explanations of the various awards and their requirements and deadlines as an ongoing addition to the newsletter. Historically there have been some intradepartmental awards with small cash amounts attached; the department head will be asked about possibly reinstating the funds for this type of award. A subcommittee of SAC, with some faculty members added, would be in charge of making these awards.

Aaron has redesigned the staff directory web page to include spaces for a picture and job titles (including area). He will be contacting staff about getting updated pictures and information as many of the current pictures are quite old. New pictures can be taken in the Goodding if staff members do not have an up-to-date picture they want used.
