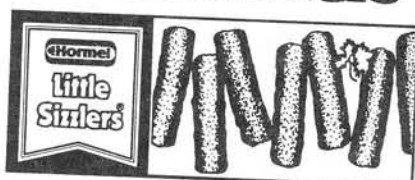

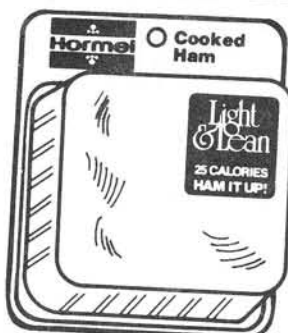

EMBLEM

The Block & Bridle Emblem is significant to club members. It represents the principles on which this club is built. Character, sincerity, and a moral life are asked of members when they join and are depicted in the straight perpendicular of the "B". The distinct curves of the "B" are symbolic of the social pleasure, mental energy and determination of members.

The meat block represents the material aspects of our life. The bridle stands for the behavior of Block and Bridle members, the control over ourselves that we try to maintain, the mannerisms and respect we show toward others, and the way which we treat animals.

PURPOSE

On December 2, 1919, student representatives from four animal husbandry clubs met in Chicago, Illinois, and formed the National Block and Bridle Club, the local clubs becoming chapters in the new national organization. Nebraska was a charter chapter along with Iowa, Kansas, and Missouri. During this meeting the chapters formed a constitution which included a statement of the clubs objectives. They are (1) To promote a higher scholastic standard among students of Animal Husbandry, (2) To promote animal husbandry, especially all phases, of student animal husbandry work in colleges and universities, (3) To bring about a closer relationship among the men and women pursuing some phase of animal husbandry as a profession.

The Nebraska Chapter of Block and Bridle Club has experienced a year of meaningful and enjoyable activities in the interest of Animal Science. This Annual is a reflection of our growing in the developing of leadership, integrity, scholarship, fellowship, cooperation, and participation. Through these activities we will grow and be better able to serve the Animal Science Industry.

Membership in the Block and Bridle Club is open to any student of agriculture, on the college level, who has a sincere interest in Animal Science.

MEETINGS

- September 9, 1985 Steak Feed. A short business meeting was held and the animal-science faculty was introduced.
- September 23, 1985 Animal Science liaison representatives were elected and all the members, initiates and advisors introduced themselves.
- October 7, 1985 Voting for B&B Queen took place and elections were held for freshmen liaison representatives.
- October 23, 1985 A regular business meeting was held with discussions on the many upcoming events. Little AK-SAR-BEN results were given.
- November 7, 1985 It was announced the hams were in and time to start selling. Dr. Aberle spoke about the completion project. The B&B Queen and Princess were introduced. Kid's Day had went well.
- November 21, 1985 A business meeting with reports on National Meetings, Christmas Coffee, and the Beef Show.
- December 5, 1985 Officer elections were held and a new office was formed to do publicity.
- January 23, 1986 Senator Jerome Warner spoke about current events taking place in the legislature. Quadrathalon, Beef Show and Quarter Horse Show were discussed.
- February 6, 1986 A short business meeting was held followed by committee meetings. A goal for more unity was set by the club and its objectives were discussed among the members.
- February 20, 1986 The top ten ham salesmen were announced. The Quiz Bowl final was held and the results of the Quadrathalon were given.
- March 6, 1986 Dr. Joe Jefferies gave a slide show on fence posts. A donations committee was set up.
- March 20, 1986 Honorary Members were chosen. Discussion on the Beef Show, Quarter Horse Show, and Honors Banquet.
- April 3, 1986 A short business meeting was held followed by committee meetings. It was announced Baxter Black was coming to speak.
- April 17, 1986 The spring initiates were initiated into the club and nominations for fall officers were opened.
- April 24, 1986 Fall officers were elected and the spring officers were sold in a slave auction. The club reflected back on the years activities.

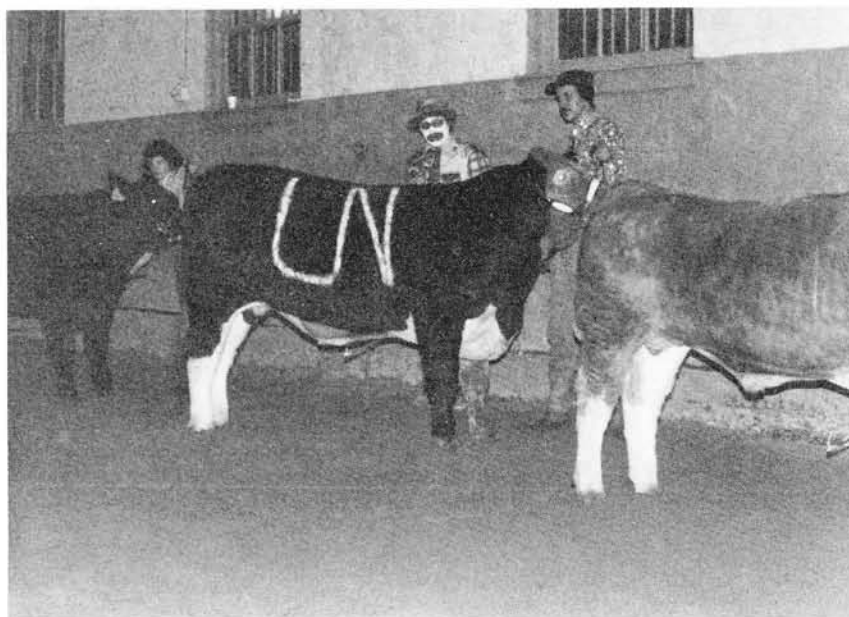

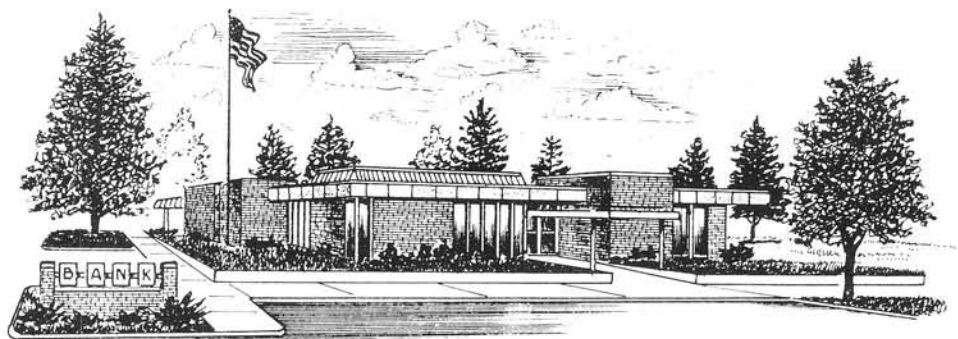
