



They are (1) To promote a higher scholastic standard among students of Animal Husbandry, (2) To promote animal husbandry, especially all phases, of student animal husbandry work in colleges and universities, (3) To bring about a closer relationship among the men and women pursuing some phase of animal husbandry as a profession.

The Nebraska Chapter of Block and Bridle Club has experienced a year of meaningful and enjoyable activities in the interest of Animal Science. March 6, 1986	Dr. Joe Jefferies gave a slide show on fence posts. A donations committee was set up.			
March 20, 1986	Honorary Members were chosen. Discussion on the Beef Show, Quarter Horse Show, and Honors Banquet.			
April 3, 1986	A short business meeting was held followed by committee meetings. It was announced Baxter Black was coming to speak.			
April 17, 1986	The spring initiates were initiated into the club and nominations for fall officers were opened.			
April 24, 1986	Fall officers were elected and the spring officers were sold in a slave auction. The club reflected back on the years activities.

"Expert" division. The winner of each species category then competes in the final Round Robin where the Grand and Reserve Champion are chosen. This year's overall winner was Sally Hircock.






