Symposium Announcement

"Celebrating Darwin's Legacy" is the title of the 35th Interdisciplinary Symposium sponsored by the Center for Great Plains Studies, University of Nebraska–Lincoln, to be held in 2009. A series of events and activities will commemorate the 200th anniversary of Charles Darwin's birth and the 150th anniversary of *The Origin of Species* beginning February 13 with a lecture by George Levine (author of *Darwin Loves You: Natural Selection and the Re-enchantment of the World*, Princeton University Press, 2006) followed a month later by three days of presentations, March 26-28, at the Nebraska Union on the UNL campus. Co-chairs of the symposium are Judy Diamond, Professor of the University Museum, and Alan Kamil, Director of the School of Biological Sciences, both at the University of Nebraska–Lincoln.

Paul A. Johnsgard, Professor emeritus of Biological Sciences at UNL, is guest curator for a special exhibition of photographs, paintings, and drawings called, *Homage to Charles Darwin*, which will be on shown at the Great Plains Art Museum, February 10 to March 30, 2009.

Daniel Leger, Professor of Psychology at UNL, and Diamond are planning curriculum presentations for Lincoln-area middle and high school science teachers.
