

Introduction

Introduction to the Seventeenth Annual Report

It is our pleasure to provide the Seventeenth Annual Report for the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR). We believe in the importance of reflecting on the accomplishments of our faculty, staff and students. The annual report offers the opportunity to review the year, and serves as an archive of accomplishments for our College. This report primarily covers the period August 1, 2009 to July 31, 2010.

We can be very proud of our University. Seventy-three schools competed for recognition as innovators in undergraduate education. Only 16 were selected. UNL is one of the 16 - the only one in our peer group as well as the only one in the Big 12. In fact, UNL is one of only five major research universities to be named 'first tier' for our innovative programs for students. The other universities are Duke University, the University of Michigan, the University of Southern California and the State University of New York at Stony Brook. We are also one of only 17 universities in the nation that are designated both landgrant and AAU. UNL continues its status as the most popular (yield of applications) public university in the country by U.S. News and World Report in its on-line rankings. We are ranked fourth among all Universities, private or public. The three private universities ranked ahead of us are Brigham Young, Harvard and Stanford.

Over the past decade our UNL Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources (IANR) scientists are among the most-cited agricultural scientists in the world. The ISE Essential Science Indicators Report, 1996-2006, indexes nearly 9,000 journals, tracking how often articles are cited by other authors. IANR is 17th in the world, 12th among universities worldwide, and 9th among American universities. The University of Nebraska-Lincoln Extension leads the nation in 4-H participation of age-eligible youth. The College's has exceptional partners in the land-grant mission. In IANR, our faculty and staff so thoroughly integrate teaching, research and extension education that the success of each is the success of all. UNL is a very special place for undergraduate education and CASNR is unique among the colleges of UNL.


- **CASNR Mission Statement:** Since the establishment of the University of Nebraska in 1869 and its commitment to the terms of the Land-Grant College Act calling for the instruction in agriculture and applied sciences, the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR) has provided opportunities for students to develop intellectually and meet the challenges of their era. CASNR fosters a student-centered learning environment where diverse basic and applied natural, life, earth and social sciences are integrated into the context of a global society and environmental stewardship. Our goal is to prepare students as leaders for a future in which demands on resources and food systems will challenge sustainability. The areas of study are broad and span animal, plant and human health and well-being, earth systems analysis, agricultural production and processing, global climate change, agricultural market structures, water resources, and land-use change. The College also has the responsibility for the coordination of all agricultural sciences and natural resources programs in higher education within the State of Nebraska.
- During the past five years (2005-2009) CASNR undergraduate enrollment [includes UNO/CASNR, excludes CAS (BIOC) and CE (AGEN and BSEN) undergraduate students] has grown 39.1%. During the same period UNL undergraduate enrollment grew 11.2% and if the CASNR data is removed from the data set, UNL (excluding CASNR) grew 9.0%.
- The vast majority of our students have a faculty adviser, some benefit from professional academic advisers complemented by faculty career mentors.
- Our College has the highest retention rate (90% freshman to sophomore) at UNL.

- We have 40 student organizations that enrich the undergraduate experience.
- Craig Brester, a Mechanized Systems Management major was named Nebraska's 2010 Senior Male Student-Athlete of the Year. Craig was a walk-on wrestler who defied odds to become a three-time NCAA All-American.
- 148 students registered for the Salute to Graduates ceremony held on May 7 which was attended by almost 750 parents and friends.
- The Doctor of Plant Health enrolled its first student, becoming the second professional program administered by the College.
- The second UNL/CASNR class in the professional program in veterinary medicine completed its two-year curriculum and will continue at Iowa State University this fall.
- The College graduated its first student from the on-line degree completion program.
- Forty-nine percent of CASNR students have college and/or departmental scholarships. During the 2009-2010 academic year, the College awarded 921 scholarships to 822 students amounting to over \$899,846.
- CASNR has a global campus with 99 students studying in 12 countries during the 2009-2010 academic year and summer 2010.
- Nearly 310 students participated in credentialed undergraduate research (84 in UCARE and the remainder in for-credit undergraduate research activities) and another 254 reported that they had a formal internship.
- We are the only College at UNL--and the only College among our peers--that has the "Ensuring Your Future" program which guarantees a job offer in their professional area within the first six months after graduation for those students fulfilling the requirements.
- Our College has one of the only satellite offices of Career Services dedicated to assisting CASNR students with finding internships and post-graduation employment. About 96% of our students (based on survey) find jobs in their fields or continue with their professional education. We routinely have one of the largest Career Fairs on campus with over 500 students visiting with representatives from 57 employing organizations about internships and full time positions last fall.
- We are now on Facebook (<u>www.facebook.com/unlcasnr</u>) and currently have 695 fans.
- Based on the Nebraska Foundation records (June 2010), the College has 20,268 graduates.
- This annual report is dedicated to the Paul F. and Virginia J.Engler Foundation which provided the single largest gift in the long history of the college to support students.

This was a year of transition in the NU Vice President and Harlan Vice Chancellor for Agriculture and Natural Resources. Dr. John Owens resigned on July 1, 2010 from the position that he held nearly 10 years. He has been a staunch supporter of the College and much of our successes have been touched by his passion, enthusiasm and leadership. We welcome Dr. Ronnie Green to the position and look forward to our continued shared successes. The College has a tradition of wonderful students, innovative academic programming, exceptional faculty advising, and successful alumni. CASNR is truly a community of scholars where faculty and students are both teachers and learners.

Dedication

The Seventeenth Annual Report is dedicated to the Paul F. and Virginia J. Engler Foundation to honor the foundation's dedication and passion for the College, agricultural industry, current students, and future entrepreneurs who have a "fire in the belly". In the Spring of 2010, the Engler Foundation provided a \$20 million permanent endowment fund to create the Engler Agribusiness Entrepreneurship Program in IANR. The gift will provide new student scholarships, an endowed chair in agribusiness entrepreneurship, program support for student courses, a lectureship series, entrepreneurship training camps in 4-H, internship placement assistance, student travel and more. It will also help create a venture capital fund to support student start-up businesses.



Paul Engler was born in Stuart, Nebraska and took an interest in agriculture at age 13 when he helped manage the family's small cattle herd and made his own cattle purchase. He studied animal science at the University of Nebraska and graduated in 1951. Engler married Virginia "Jinx" Engler in 1981 in Amarillo. Also a Nebraskan, Virginia grew up in Valentine and attended Valentine High School and the University of Nebraska. She passed away on Dec. 16, 1996. Currently Paul resides in Amarillo where he is an owner of Cactus Feeders, a company he formed in 1975, which is now the world's largest privately owned cattle feeding operation with locations across northern Texas and southwest Kansas.

The resources provided by donor's like the Paul F. and Virginia J. Engler Foundation make it possible to continue to offer exceptional experiences to our students, tomorrow's future leaders. The passion and vision shared by the Engler Foundation Board members, Sara E. Cady, Caroline M. Fauks, Michael J. Engler, Claudia M. Gilson, Jerry D. Miller and Richard Ware II, coupled with Paul's dream have provided a lasting legacy for Virginia, Paul and the entire Engler family. The College would also like to

thank Ann Bruntz from the NU Foundation for fostering the relationship with the Engler Foundation which allowed Paul's dream to become a reality.

FACULTY ADVISING COUNCIL

The Faculty Advisory Council (FAC) met the second Monday of each month this past academic year. In addition to discussing and providing input to the CASNR Dean, each meeting centered on current issues facing the College and its students/faculty.

The year began with a Planning and Transition Meeting held on August 18, 2009 to prepare for the academic year. Jay Barbuto, 2008-2009 Chair of the FAC, led the group in discussion. Ron Hanson became Chair for 2009-2010 and Kathy Hanford Vice-Chair.

Highlights from the 2009-2010 academic year:

- The ad hoc committee finalized the second CASNR Image Survey and sent approximately 2,000 surveys to high school students and 2,000 to UNL students this spring. Volunteers serving were Jay Barbuto, Chair; Rick Stowell, Ron Hanson, Steve Jones and Dann Husmann. The Survey results will be available at the 2010 August Planning and Transition Meeting on August 17 and will be discussed by FAC members.
- Discussed the evaluation of faculty in Professor of Practice positions. IANR has guidelines in promotion in their bylaws. A questionnaire was sent to promotion and tenure chairs. Results indicated that units were being consistent in the evaluation process as well as reporting adequate feedback to Professor of Practice faculty members. After FAC discussion, it was approved that no further action be taken.
- The "Classroom and Teaching Lab Improvement Committee" of Rick Stowell, Chair; Rod Moxley, and David Carter continued to determine what can be done to use facilities more efficiently and effectively. A "Summary of CASNR-Controlled Classroom Data" was provided. The Council accepted this as the final report.
- A survey was sent to CASNR faculty regarding the use of computers in the classroom. It might be possible to phase out computer labs in a couple of years if students have laptops.
- Appropriate use of A+ grades was discussed and input from departments was compiled. The consensus was that instructors are responsible for determining and publishing the criteria by which student grades will be assigned in their courses. It was approved by FAC that currently there is not a need for a CASNR policy regarding A+ grading.

Monthly meeting agendas also included reports from the CASNR Dean's Office, Enrollment Management Update Committee, and ad hoc committees.

CASNR TEACHING AND LEARNING IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The Council planned and sponsored the 43rd annual CASNR Winter Interim Workshop on January 8, 2010. The workshop focused on how to engage students in inquiry-based learning in small and large classrooms. The NSF-funded project, Process-oriented guided inquiry learning (POGIL) was facilitated by Karen Anderson, Cheryl Bailey and Mark Burbach. POGIL uses guided inquiry - a version of the Socratic method in which students use carefully designed materials that guide them to construct new knowledge. It is a student-centered strategy. Students work in small groups with individual roles to ensure that all students are fully engaged in the learning process. POGIL develops process skills such as critical thinking, problems solving, and communication through collaboration and reflection, making students more competitive in a global market. Workshop participants experienced this inquiry-based learning approach, and mapped this approach with the learning cycle.

The TLIC also hosted a series of brown-bag seminars in the fall of 2009 for faculty participating in a study involving the development of student critical thinking skill. In addition, the TLIC encouraged faculty participation in teaching and learning seminars hosted by CASNR departments as well as visiting faculty lectures across the UNL campus.





Some projects have gone into further development leading to patents.

FMRI and MEG Compatible Bicycle

Learning to walk is a major difficulty for many cerebral palsy patients. Providing effective therapy, which causes improvements in brain activity involved in motor control, is vital to the treatment of the disease. Unfortunately, current methods for measuring brain activity, such as the use of magnetoencephalography (MEG), lack the ability to measure neural activity while walking due to geometric constraints of the chair and gantry. The design team proposed the use of a stationary MEG compatible bicycle to provide an analog to walking. The apparatus is unique in that the patients can keep their upper body stationary and still move their legs. The apparatus is of wood and PVC construction and is fastened with glue and dowels which accommodate the MEG device. The apparatus is adjustable and can accommodate patients of various body sizes. Researchers will be able to observe the brain activity produced by pedaling and determine if the therapy is leading to the expected outcome.

Hell Creek Stabilization Design

Hell Creek is a deeply incised stream in Omaha, Nebraska, located near I-80. Residential urbanization has caused Hell Creek to channel high velocities which degrade the banks and bridge supports, thereby causing a narrow corridor. Narrow corridors do not allow for natural dissipation of energy from erosive rain events that a stream with a natural floodplain has. Our team proposed a design that expands the corridor and protects banks and bridge structures from future degradation with instream structures and bioengineering techniques. The final design included a bioengineering site plan with geometry channel modifications, plan for educational outreach, and a cost analysis.

Prairie Pines Water Retention Structure

A former University of Nebraska-Lincoln faculty member donated a tract of land to UNL upon his retirement. This land is used as an environmental education center for various classes, particularly in the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources. Current land management is requesting a water source that attracts wildlife to facilitate course observation. Design options need to consider installation and maintenance specifics, as well as financial scope. Design options must consider ramifications caused by future changes made to the watershed, potentially outside of UNL land, within the Stevens Creek Watershed.

Neck Model for Ultrasound Assisted Biopsy Training

Thyroid nodules are found in nearly 50% of the U.S. population. Once detected, physicians must biopsy thyroid or lymph node nodules through ultrasound-guided fine-needle biopsy, a procedure in which a physician uses ultrasound imaging to guide a needle into an abnormal nodule and retrieve a biopsy. These procedures are performed daily by physicians on thousands of patients each year. Due to the frequency of these procedures and the precise technical skill required to obtain the biopsies, a need exists to design a model of the neck which can be used to train physicians to perform these procedures. This design project involved the selection of materials to mimic human tissue on ultrasound and the production of an ultrasound-able model of the neck using the selected materials.

Roger's Memorial Farm Runoff Monitoring System

No-till and other production agricultural practices are very important when it comes to conserving soil and increasing water quality in our environment. However, very little data is available on a large-scale watershed to prove the usefulness of these practices. We proposed the installation of two run-off monitoring stations at two agriculture sub-water sheds at UNL's Roger's Memorial Farm. These runoff monitoring stations will have the capability to collect sediment and chemical samples, as well as monitor rainfall and real time runoff flows from the watersheds. The design consisted of an ISCO type sampler and three foot H-flume. With these stations, faculty and students will have the ability to collect valuable data.

2010 Quarter Scale Tractor Team

Every year the American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers (ASABE) sponsors a competition that requires student teams to design, test, and build a quarter-scale sized pulling tractor. This competition allows students to gain real world experience in designing, building, marketing and managing a team. This year's design was a two-wheel drive tractor, powered by four engines and had a continuously variable transmission. One of the more innovative parts of the tractor is the front axle which provides suspension without the added weight of springs by use of a rubber torsion axle. The project included marketing information and engineering analysis. The end product was a reliable, powerful, easy-to-use operator friendly tractor.

Measuring Facial and Lingual Stiffness

Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), often called "Lou Gehrig's disease," is the most common motor neuron disorder in the world. A side effect of ALS is different degrees of stiffness in the lingual muscles of the patient. Determining the stiffness of the muscle is critical to diagnose ALS but has not been quantitatively determined. This design presented an innovative method to determine the stiffness (shear modulus) of the tongue for more accurate diagnosis of ALS. Stiffness is intrinsically found as a ratio of the input frequency and the resonant frequency. From this design, the resonant frequency data of different representations of the tongue was obtained and interpreted.

Biomass Pickup

Coming up with new, efficient, and environmentally friendly ways to produce energy is an ongoing process. One area, biomass energy production, has really shown some potential, particularly because of the large availability of feedstock. The use of corn cobs as a feedstock has seen minimal use thus far, but has the ability to blossom into a large-scale source. This project involved testing, analyzing, and modifying a design that will hopefully become a real player in the up and coming renewable energy sector. The increasing cooperation and coordination of government, technology, agriculture, and economic demand will allow the world to decrease its dependence on fossil fuels and take a big step towards cleaner, more sustainable energy.

February Forum

On February 9, 2010, the February Forum, which is sponsored by the Center for Mathematics and Computer Education, was held at the Holiday Inn Downtown. A buffet dinner was followed by a program and a speaker.

ALUMNI PROJECTS

The College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources Alumni Association is a constituent society of the College. It is the only alumni association that provides support to the College.

The fifth Football Reunion since the Association became independent was attended by 125 alumni. Eighty tickets were made available for the Arkansas State game and an informative lunch and program included a silent auction which generated \$5198 for student scholarships. The Henry Beachell Distinguished Alumni Award was presented to Paul Engler of Amarillo, TX.

The Salute to Graduates ceremony, a tradition established by Vice Chancellor John Owens and developed by CASNR Dean Steve Waller and his staff, continues to receive praise from attendees. Parents, family, friends, faculty, staff and graduates appreciate its personalized focus and individual recognition. Over 3,700 family members and friends have experienced this rich campus environment to attend Salute ceremonies each May and December in the Nebraska East Union. An abbreviated version of "Ag College Dreams" is shown during the Salute ceremony. It highlights an interesting 138-year evolution of the College and does a wonderful job of setting the stage for the Salute event. Participating graduates receive the complete 29-minute version as a gift.

The May 2010 'Salute' was the largest since the program began in December of 2005. A large graduating cohort of 209 plus the second two-year class of 24 Professional Program in Veterinary Medicine students resulted in 135 students participating. Parents, relatives, faculty and staff brought the total number of people on hand for the ceremony to approximately 810. Closed-circuit TV was provided by Communication and Information Technology staff so that graduates, departmental representatives and some guests could watch from overflow seating in the Terrace Dining area.

The Listserv of members and friends of the College is maintained with new subscribers and address updates and provides cost-effective electronic communications. Three issues of <u>The Sower Online</u> were sent to over 1300 alumni and friends with e-mail addresses and two print editions of <u>The Sower</u>, the College alumni newsletter, were mailed to 2000 members with copies of the College news magazine <u>Class Acts</u>. Subscribers were notified of NE Educational TV's airing of Ag College Dreams.

CASNR Emeriti Faculty were brought into the Alumni Association as Honorary Emeriti Life Members, creating an Emeriti Chapter of approximately 150 members.

The College alumni association participated in Salute to Graduates, Senior Send Off, the CASNR Career Fair, Nebraskans for Nebraska, CASNR Week Banquet and the annual football reunion and scholarship benefit silent auction.

The CASNRAA Board met three times: October in Lincoln and February and July in Kearney.



Substitutions and Waivers

The Substitutions and Waiver forms give students the opportunity to request a substitution or waiver of a CASNR core or departmental requirement. The form is initiated by the student, approved by the student's adviser and the department head, and then sent to the Dean's Office for review and final approval. Students must file a request for substitutions and waivers involving courses within the basic four-year curriculum in CASNR before the start of the fall semester for December graduates, before the start of the spring semester for May graduates and prior to the last day of classes spring semester for August graduates. The table below illustrates the number of individual course requests from each degree. Degrees in the "other" category include those degrees with fifty or fewer substitution requests. Those degrees consist of Agricultural Journalism, Biological Systems Engineering, Environmental Restoration Science, Food Science and Technology, Grassland Ecology and Management, Grazing Livestock Systems, Hospitality, Restaurant and Tourism Management, Insect Science, Natural Resource and Environmental Economics, Plant Biology, Plant Pathology, Veterinary Technology and Water Science.

RECRUITMENT ACTIVITIES

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL) College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR) attracts students with a wide range of interests. With 28 degree programs and two preprofessional programs, CASNR offers a variety of interest areas for both rural and urban students. While CASNR has traditionally had a population base that is largely from rural areas, demographic changes in the state have translated to a higher percentage of CASNR students from urban areas. With its mix of degree programs and a steady demand for its graduates, the education and experiences offered through CASNR provide exciting opportunities to all students.

In an effort to recruit students to our College, CASNR partners with UNL Admissions, Nebraska Extension, public and private schools, communities, alumni, stakeholders, business and industry.

CASNR recruitment efforts for the 2009-2010 year include the following:

Experience the Power of Red (October) – Nearly 300 prospective students and parents attended the annual CASNR open house. During the day, attendees had the opportunity to attend sessions to learn more about the degree programs, visit academic program presentations and ask current students questions during lunch. A parent session was also held and highlighted financial aid/scholarships and other programs and services. East Campus tours were also offered.

Contact Campaign - Beginning with invitations (sent in August) for Experience the Power of Red in October, the CASNR Dean's Office contacted more than 1,000 prospective students monthly by email and mail to connect with them, learn about their interests and concerns and answer questions they had regarding coming to UNL and CASNR.

For those students who expressed interests in specific programs, their letters were tailored to their interests.

Seniors interested in CASNR were contacted monthly by the Dean's Office. Academic programs were encouraged to follow up with students with email, mail and phone contacts on an individual basis with students.

Admitted students received a letter of congratulations from the Dean, holiday greetings (if admitted prior to December), admitted student event invitation, and a final mailing. Upon attending New Student Enrollment, students also received a letter inviting them to participate in Dean's Scholars in Experiential Leadership, as well as a mailing informing them on how to get involved on campus. Parents of admitted students received a letter from the Dean highlighting key aspects of CASNR.

In February, all of our admitted students were contacted by ambassadors and other current students who answered questions and gauged their interest in attending UNL.

Admitted Student Event (February) — CASNR hosted a dinner for admitted students and their parents. During the event, students had the opportunity to learn more about our academic programs and departments, meet with faculty and staff, as well as speak to current students.

Partnering with Admissions

Campus Visits – The majority of campus visits start at the UNL Admissions Office with an overview and tour followed by a visit to East Campus, a personal visit with faculty/staff in students' areas of interest and tours, if desired. CASNR hosted nearly 350 campus visits.

Admissions Office Updates – Each August, UNL college deans visit with UNL Admissions staff regarding college updates and programs.

Red Letter Days — UNL open house days had anywhere from 200-500 students and parents visiting campus and included a browsing session as well as general sessions in the morning. Students with interests in CASNR travel to East Campus to join the CASNR Deans, staff and ambassadors for lunch followed by a CASNR presentation, time to visit with faculty members in their areas of interest and a brief tour.

Transfer Workshops and Transfer College Visits – Hosted transfer students visiting UNL and coordinated visits to Nebraska community colleges.

Big Red Road Show – Numerous CASNR Units/Extension areas participated in the Big Red Road Show in Omaha (February) and Scottsbluff (March). Our area featured a Nebraska snake exhibit, a master gardener to answer questions and a variety of other exhibits. For each activity in which guests participated, visitors were given a CASNR dollar that was exchanged at the CASNR booth for various CASNR prizes.

Business/Extension/Community (Outreach) Partnerships

State Fair (August-September) – Had a booth in Agriculture Hall, Cyber Fair, the 4-H and FFA buildings. In addition, CASNR distributed candy bars to 4-H and FFA exhibitors and their parents during check-in. CASNR faculty, staff and students staffed the booth during key times. CASNR also hosted the CASNR Amazing Race for UNL students.

Husker Harvest Days (September) – Set-up a CASNR display and talked with visitors during the three-day trade show. Also gave away t-shirts to prospective students who registered for a CASNR scholarship drawing.

York Careers in Agriculture Day (September) – Students from surrounding schools were hosted by Cornerstone Bank; 150 students attended a career session presented by the CASNR Career Specialist.

*Nebraska Farm Bureau Annual Meetin*g (December) – A CASNR booth was on display at the Nebraska Farm Bureau Annual Meeting.

National Cattlemen's Beef Association Convention/Trade Show(February) - Worked with faculty to coordinate booth, personnel, materials and activities to represent CASNR at NCBA annual meeting.

Gudmundsen Field Day, Whitman, NE (April) – Over 200 youth attended an all-day event. CASNR presented information on academics in related areas, UNL and career opportunities.

Denver Stock Show (January) – CASNR was represented at this annual event in Denver. Several faculty, staff and students staffed the display.

National Pork Expo (June) - Worked with faculty to coordinate booth, personnel and materials to represent CASNR at the event.

FFA

National FFA Convention – CASNR hosted a display at this event in Indianapolis, IN, which attracts thousands of students from across the U.S.

State FFA Convention – CASNR had a booth on display at the Cornhusker Hotel, hosted an East Campus scavenger hunt, and provided ten \$500 scholarships to the Career Development Exam (CDE) winners. CASNR also offered East Campus tours and one-on-one visits with professors.

Multicultural Recruitment

UNL Achievement Banquet (November) – Attended dinner honoring Omaha-area students and visited with students interested in CASNR programs.

UNL Academic Days

(attracts students who may not be aware of possible CASNR degree programs)

Math Day (November) – CASNR set up a display/hosted an activity for high school students on campus for annual math competition.

Other Events

Science Olympiad (April) – East Campus served as the host for more than 500 Nebraska students who attended this annual event. Science competitions were held in various East Campus buildings and opening and closing ceremonies were held in the Nebraska East Union and Hardin Hall. Every high school first place team in each event was awarded a \$500 CASNR scholarship. Middle school first place teams received a \$100 scholarship for Advanced Scholars Classes. The first place school in the middle and high school division also received a \$1,000 travel voucher from CASNR and the Agricultural Research Division.

Nebraska Cattlemen Ads — In this publication, CASNR had ads featuring the Agricultural Economics, Agronomy and Horticulture, and Animal Science departments.

NEBRASKAland Ads — The School of Natural Resources programs of study are featured in ads in this publication.

EAST CAMPUS VISITORS CENTER

This year was a busy one for the East Campus Visitors Center (ECVC). Traffic has picked up due to the increase in Dairy Store customers. There have been a lot of elementary school groups coming to tour the Dairy Store and assume that the ECVC is the place to start. The ECVC is a welcoming place for students and campus visitors alike, as it is both a source of information as well as a starting point for campus visits for prospective students. Approximately 395 campus visits to East Campus have been coordinated through the ECVC, and well over 1,800 visitors have stopped into the Center. The majority of these needed directions to campus departments and attractions.

Visitor Guide: The UNL Visitors Guide was published for the second year. It features both City and East Campuses, and is a popular item for folks to pick up.

Videos: University Communications and Educational Media (formerly CIT) continue to provide a diverse assortment of videos on the screens. An effort is made to provide a balance of video clips representing UNL as a whole as well as clips specific to East Campus and CASNR.

Collaborations: The Own Time, Any Time self-guided East Campus cell phone tour created by the Department of Agronomy & Horticulture continues to be popular. A sign promoting the tour is needed, and has been requested.

Emily Levine, from Agronomy & Horticulture, has been coordinating a series of garden/Arboretum tours this summer. Held on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month, these tours continue to be well attended.

RETENTION ACTIVITIES

CASNR Cares

The College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR) developed the CASNR CARES Program – Caring Attitudes and Respect for Every Student. The CASNR CARES program provides a single contact for parents, students, faculty and staff seeking assistance in navigating the university's student services programs. The primary goal is to ensure that each student becomes acclimated to the campus environment, engages in his/her own education and has every opportunity to be successful. It also provides a significant resource for family and faculty/staff to identify students that may need assistance in enhancing their educational experience. Our college is committed to the welfare and academic success of each of our students.

The CASNR CARES program respects all standards of confidentiality when gathering and sharing information that may affect a student's academic or personal growth. The program works with the student to develop a course of action to help the student meet his or her academic and personal goals, as well as the goals of the University. Sue Voss, Student Development and Events Director for CASNR, is the primary contact for the CASNR CARES program.

Faculty, staff, parents or students can initiate a referral by contacting Sue. She will contact the student, make an appointment to have them come to her office, and then meet with the student to determine if assistance is needed. Without identifying the sources of the concern, the student is encouraged to discuss how things are going, both in and out of the classroom. Students appreciate the attention that is provided to them plus they can learn more about the resources available across campus.

In cases where students must be away from campus due to health or family emergencies, Sue will gather information and can contact the instructors for the student's classes. Letting them know of the student's situations, she will also stay in contact with the student after hearing from the instructors and updating the faculty about the return of the student to classes. Both the student and the faculty members appreciate the information that is provided which helps the student stay current in class. For 2004-2005, Sue had 257 contacts regarding CASNR CARES. For 2005-2006, she had 461 contacts; for 2006-2007 there were 544 contacts; for 2007-2008 there were 422 contacts and for 2008-2009 there were 382; for 2009-2010 there was no data available.

Dean's Scholars in Experiential Leadership Program for 2009-2010

Fifty-nine freshmen from Nebraska, California, Kansas, Missouri and Iowa participated in the Dean's Scholars in Experiential Leadership (DSEL) program for 2009-2010. This endeavor was created by CASNR to bring students together in the college with an interest in further developing their leadership skills. The exciting program is a great way for students to become fully engaged in the college. It gives them the capacity and confidence to seek leadership positions now and in their professional careers.

Each week, students attend weekly sessions hosted by **Steve Waller**, Dean of CASNR. Students took the testing instrument for StrengthsQuest, a program developed by the Gallup Organization to determine student's top five personal strengths. Other topics include career portfolio development, leadership on campus, study abroad and health and wellness. Teaching Assistants were **JoLeisa Cramer**, **McKenzie McAuliffe**, **Katie Beck**, **Ann O'Brien and Emilee Bruns**.

We were Pen Pals with 59 Hartley Elementary second graders, a neighborhood elementary school. We decorated sweatshirts for our Pen Pals; they keep their sweatshirts at their desk in case the second grader doesn't dress appropriately for the weather. We provided hats and mittens during the Holiday Break in December; we made homework kits in February and also sent special invitations to our Pen Pals to attend Community Night in April. We also had six special needs third graders as pen pals for an additional group of elementary students.

Blackboard

Sue Voss and **Jill Brown** send out weekly emails to all CASNR students using Blackboard. Emails consist of club meeting information, deadlines, events on campus and information vital to students. Jill sends out weekly career updates about companies that are interviewing on campus and job openings. Sue also made groups for New Freshmen students, Out-Of-State Students and Students of Color for MANRRS. Contacting these special interest groups throughout the year was extremely easy and quick to do.

TeamMates

Sue Voss was trained at the Mentor Training Program for TeamMates. Several meetings were held to find students who were interested in being a mentor for the TeamMates Program. Twelve CASNR students were TeamMates Mentors during the 2009-2010 school year. They were placed at various schools in Lincoln. Linda Major from the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs is coordinating all of the TeamMates for the University of Nebraska – Lincoln.

Employment Seminar (AGRI/NRES 388)

Employment Seminar was held on Tuesday evenings from 6-8 p.m. for the first eight weeks of the fall semester. Subjects covered included: resume and cover letter development; job search strategies on the Internet/Husker Hire Link; job search ethics and job offer evaluation; interviewing and professional etiquette; preparing for a career fair; industry mock interviews; and etiquette dinner and discussion. Thirty-seven students participated.

Job Survival (AGRI 496)

Job Survival was held on Tuesday evenings from 6-8 p.m. for the first eight weeks of the spring semester. Topics include Advice from Recently Employed Students; Effective Communication; Advancement; 401(k)'s, Benefits, Investments; Credit; Entrepreneurship, and Relocation and Housing. Class is team taught by sixteen employers from various industries. Forty-two students participated.

International Affairs

CASNR is committed to helping its students benefit from international study at UNL in four areas: study abroad, the CASNR International Minor, **Introduction to Global Agriculture and Natural Resources (AGRI 282)**, and Beyond Borders. These areas will enable students to explore the global aspects of their respective degree programs and gain new perspectives of the world so that they will be more competitive in an increasingly global marketplace.

For Study Abroad, CASNR provided \$25,192 in scholarships to 93 students to study in 10 countries last year.

Short Term Study Abroad Opportunities (less than a semester) included group study in New Zealand, Argentina, Puerto Rico, England, France and Ireland. In addition, long-term study abroad (semester or academic year) and internships (supervised work experience) were arranged. Increasingly students are organizing their own unique, long-term or internship experiences assisted by CASNR staff. For 2011 study abroad opportunities led by CASNR faculty will include:

Winter Break 2010-11 – short-term study in Australia; Spring Semester – short-term study in Puerto Rico; Summer – short-term study in France, Namibia, England, Croatia, Costa Rica and Germany; and Winter Break 2011-2012 in New Zealand. Fall, Spring or Summer semester study will be available for individuals in Mexico and other countries chosen by students. Internships are planned for Croatia next summer.

The **CASNR Minor in International Agriculture and Natural Resources** allows students to build a concentration of courses to meet their individual needs within CASNR guidelines. We feel this flexible minor fits well with CASNR degree programs and helps prepare students more broadly for careers in agriculture and natural resources whether they plan for a career in other countries or in Nebraska. Advising for the minor is done by the CASNR Dean's staff and faculty volunteers in other Departments.

CASNR students are required to take at least one "internationally focused course." They may elect to meet this requirement from a long list of courses in languages, geography, political science, economics, anthropology and humanities. CASNR also offers Introduction to Global Agriculture and Natural Resources (AGRI 282). This course helps students learn about global issues and inter-relationships that affect Nebraska. It meets the new ACE requirements for global awareness and human diversity as well as providing some practice with basic skills in teamwork and problem solving.

Beyond Borders is a CASNR student organization formed last year. It allows U. S. students to mix with students from other countries, learn about study abroad from other students and faculty leaders, and to fund-raise for their own study abroad. Last year Beyond Borders hosted a "welcome back picnic" in September for students and faculty with international interests, a "holiday international social mixer" in January, information meetings on study abroad programs, and guest speakers on international topics from other universities, the Nebraska Department of Agriculture and a former employee of the United Nations. Beyond Borders was named the outstanding CASNR student organization for 2009-2010.

Annual Faculty Meeting

The 2009 CASNR Annual Faculty Meeting was held on August 20 at the Nebraska East Union. Dr. John Owens, NU Vice President and IANR Vice Chancellor, provided opening remarks. New faculty and faculty with new teaching appointments were introduced. Steven Kaiser, Treasurer of CASNR Student Advisory Council and a senior in the Food Science and Technology degree program, gave the Student Perspective. Dean Steve Waller presented a brief overview of CASNR accomplishments in 2008-2009.

Interim Workshop

Participants braved frigid temperatures to participate in the 43rd annual CASNR Winter Interim Workshop on January 8th, 2010. The workshop focused on how to engage students in inquiry-based learning in small and large classrooms. The NSF-funded project, "Process-oriented Guided Inquiry Learning" (POGIL) was facilitated by Karen Anderson, Cheryl Bailey and Mark Burbach. POGIL uses guided inquiry – a version of the Socratic method in which students use carefully designed materials that guide them to construct new knowledge. It is a student-centered strategy. Students work in small groups with individual roles to ensure that all students are fully engaged in the learning process. POGIL develops process skills such as critical thinking, problem solving, and communication through collaboration and reflection, making students more competitive in a global market. Workshop participants experienced this inquiry-based learning approach, and mapped this approach with the learning cycle. Assessment of the workshop showed the cold weather did not dampen the interest of faculty in learning about inquiry-based approaches. 

Graduate Student Enrollment


Graduate student data represents students enrolled on the sixth-day census (Fall 2009) and non-enrolled students actively pursuing graduate degrees. The graduate program in the Agricultural Research Division (College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources and the College of Education and Human Sciences) increased 4.5% from the Fall Semester 2008 to the Fall Semester 2009. Thirty-two percent of the graduate students in CASNR degree programs are supported by assistantships (state appropriated GRA and GTA, fellowships, and international agency or foreign country support). Twenty-five percent of the students in the College of Education and Human Sciences are supported. Twenty-seven percent of CASNR students were not enrolled in IANR graduate programs on the sixth day of the semester.
