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Arts Around the World Club Curriculum Spring 2019

Grade Level: Kindergarten through second grade

Ideal Number of Attendees: 7-15 students

Goal of Club: Increase the cultural and global awareness of students

Resources: Various Pinterest ideas

Content Areas: Social Studies and Arts

Final Products: Weekly crafts that are related to the country being studied

Introduction to Club: This Arts Around the World club introduces students to other countries and cultures through engaging crafts

<u>Length of Club:</u> 1 hour and 15 minutes

<u>Tips and Tricks:</u> Have extra activities (such as coloring pages or worksheets) available for children who finish at a faster pace, and watch for students who are becoming distracted.

Weekly Lesson Plans

Week 1: Flags

- 1. <u>Introduction to Club</u>
 - a. Set up club expectations and introduction
- 2. Craft: Make your own flag!
 - a. Background:
 - i. Define what a flag is
 - ii. What does the American flag look like?
 - iii. How do some other flags look?
 - iv. Brief overview on the significance of the colors on a flag
 - b. Instructions:
 - i. If you had your own country, how would you design your flag? It can represent your favorite things. . .
 - c. Materials:

- i. Colored paper (as many different colors as possible)
- ii. Drawing materials (pencils, markers/crayons/colored pencils)
- iii. Scissors
- iv. Glue sticks

3. Reflection

- a. What worked:
 - i. The students really enjoyed the activity and made some amazing flags.
- b. What didn't:
 - i. Some students finished the activity much faster than others, and then started to disengage and act out.

Week 2: France

- 1. Introduction
 - a. How does the flag look, what is the capital, language spoken, and other fun facts
 - i. Ask the kids if they already know something about the country
- 2. Craft: Water lily paper craft

- a. Background:
 - i. Who was Claude Monet?
 - ii. How did his paintings look?
- b. Instructions:
 - i. Kids make their own version of Claude Monet's water lily paintings
 - 1. Use a piece of colored paper as a base
 - 2. Tear pieces of paper in different colors into stips and glue them onto the base
 - 3. Tear green pieces of paper to make lily pads, and also glue them down
 - 4. Glue cupcake lines on the lily pads
 - 5. Glue a piece of paper into the lily pads
- c. Materials:
 - i. Colored construction paper (white, pink, green, blue, light blue, and purple)
 - ii. Glue sticks
 - iii. Cupcake liners (white or light pink)
- 3. Bonus Activity
 - a. If kids finish early, let them dance to French folk music
 - b. French coloring pages
- 4. Reflection
 - a. What worked:

- i. The children enjoyed the activity
- b. What didn't:
 - i. Some students had a hard time with following directions and

Week 3: Greece

- 1. Introduction
 - a. How does the flag look, what is the capital, language spoken, and other fun facts
 - i. Ask the kids if they already know something about the country
- 2. <u>Craft:</u> Ancient Greek Pottery
 - a. Background:
 - i. Quick facts about ancient Greek culture
 - ii. Importance of pottery
 - iii. Show them examples
 - 1. What did the decorations mean?
 - b. Instructions:
 - i. Kids will replicate ancient Greek pottery by drawing their own myth on terracotta pots
 - c. Materials:
 - i. Small terracotta pots
 - ii. Black markers/paint
 - iii. Printed examples of Greek patterns
- 3. Extra Activity
 - a. Greek coloring pages
- 4. Reflection
 - a. What worked:
 - i. When all of the students were finished, they competed in "Olympic Events"
 - b. What didn't:
 - Some students had a difficult time being respectful and following directions

Week 4: Russia

- 1. Introduction
 - a. How does the flag look, what is the capital, language spoken, and other fun facts
 - i. Ask the kids if they already know something about the country
- 2. Craft: Matryoshka Dolls

- a. Background:
 - i. What are matryoshka dolls

- ii. What do they look like
- iii. Significance

b. Instructions:

- i. The kids will use markers/pencils to draw the outline of their design on each doll
- ii. They will then use other supplies to add decorations and color

c. Materials:

- i. 3-4 cups of different sizes (preferably white or without a pattern)
 - 1. The cups must be able to stack on top of each other
- ii. Drawing supplies (pencils, markers, crayons, and/or colored pencils)
 - a. If the cups are plastic or styrofoam, then the markers need to be permanent
- iii. Possibly stickers to add on to the cups

3. Reflection

- a. What worked:
 - i. The students enjoyed the activity
- b. What didn't:
 - i. Washable markers do not draw well on styrofoam and paper cups, and tend to smear easily

Week 5: Ireland

1. Introduction

- a. How does the flag look, what is the capital, language spoken, and other fun facts
 - i. Ask the kids if they already know something about the country

2. Craft: Bodhran Drum

- a. Background: https://www.maestroclassics.com/-bodhraacuten-frame-drum.html
- b. Instructions:
 - 1. Trace the inside of the hoop on a sheet of paper
 - 2. Draw a (Celtic) design inside the traced circle on the paper
 - 3. Take the design and fit it into the hoop, face down
 - 4. Carefully work the inner part of the hoop into the frame with the design in between
 - 5. Once the paper is in place, carefully tighten the hoop
 - 6. Make the tipper for the drum by putting and eraser on both sides of a pencil, and then wrapping pipe cleaner around the ends

c. Materials:

- i. Embroidery hoops (preferably 4 or 6 inches)
- ii. Pencils
- iii. Pipe cleaners (2 per student)

- iv. Plain white paper
- v. Arrowhead erasers

3. Reflection

- a. What worked:
 - i. The students really enjoyed the activity
- b. What didn't:
 - i. The students needed adult help in order to put the drum together

Week 6: Czech Republic

- 1. Introduction
 - a. Where is the country, what is the language spoken, etc.
 - b. Say that I speak Czech and ask if anyone else knows a different language
- 2. <u>Craft: Easter Egg Decorating</u>
 - a. Background
 - b. Instructions:
 - 1. Take an egg, and start drawing a design!
 - c. Materials:
 - i. Eggshells, or a substitute for an egg
 - ii. Colored markers
- 3. Extra Activity
 - a. Play Czech children's cartoons, such as *Pat and Mat* or *Bob a Bobek*
- 4. Reflection
 - a. What worked
 - i. The students had fun and were engaged.
 - b. What didn't
 - i. Rather than drawing a pattern or design on their eggs, the students opted to make their eggs a solid color.

Week 7: China

- 1. <u>Introduction</u>
 - a. Where is the country, what is the language spoken, etc
- 2. Craft: Paper Plate Hand Fans
 - a. Background: https://thepinterestedparent.com/2017/01/paper-plate-hand-fans/
 - b. Instructions:
 - 1. Take the paper plate, and draw a small half-circle on the bottom using a marker
 - 2. Using the paint, color/design the plate, and wait for it to dry
 - 3. Once the paint is dry, add designs using stickers and marker

4. After the design is complete, glue the craft sticks to the bottom to make handles

c. Materials:

- i. White paper plates (cut in half)
- ii. Jumbo craft sticks (2 per person)
- iii. Paint in red and black (preferably washable)
- iv. Liquid glue
- v. Stickers (preferably gold)
- vi. Black markers
- vii. Painting supplies

3. <u>Reflection</u>

- a. What worked:
 - i. The students enjoyed painting and making a craft that they could "use"
- b. What didn't:
 - i. While waiting for the paint to dry, a lot of students disengaged. Also, some of the "fans" were not completely dry at the end of club.

Week 8: Australia

- 1. Introduction
 - a. Where is the country, what language is spoken, etc
- 2. <u>Craft: Newspaper koala</u>

- i. Instructions:
 - 1. Cut a big circle and 2 little circles out of newspaper
 - 2. Glue them onto the colored paper, so that the big circle is the head, and the little ones are ears
 - 3. Cut an oval out of the black paper (this will be the nose)
 - 4. Glue the nose and googly eyes onto the koala
- ii. Materials:
 - 1. Newspaper
 - 2. Glue
 - 3. Scissors
 - 4. Construction paper
 - 5. Googly eyes

Week 9: Mexico

- 1. Introduction
 - a. Where is the country, what is the language spoken, etc
- 2. Craft: Ojos de dios

a. Instructions:

- i. Take the 2 craft sticks and glue them in an "X" shape
- ii. Cut some yarn in different colors, and tie them together
- iii. Start wrapping it around the sticks
- iv. Once done, tie the yarn

b. Materials

- i. Yarn (in multiple colors)
- ii. Small craft sticks (2 per student)
- iii. Scissors
- iv. Glue

3. <u>Reflection</u>

- a. What worked:
 - i. The students enjoyed the craft, and the activity lasted the entire club
- b. What didn't:
 - i. The students needed a lot of help setting up the craft, so it would have been useful to have another adult help out.
