Dr. Adams, known as Charlie to most of us, served as the Nebraska Chapter Historian from 1965 through 1998. The Nebraska Chapter Gamma Sigma Delta says **THANK YOU** to Dr. Charles H. Adams for his 34 years as our Historian. Charlie has been a dedicated historian along with maintaining the Chapter's membership records. We look forward to his continued service as Membership Chair.

The Nebraska Chapter initiated 56 new members at the November 22, 1998 Initiation and Awards Banquet. The new members represented 40 undergraduate students, 10 graduate students, five faculty and staff, and one alumnus. The new alumni member is Roger Wehrbein, a farmer from Plattsmouth who is currently serving as a State Senator and Chair of the Legislature's Appropriations Committee. Senator Wehrbein received his B.S. degree in 1960 from the University of Nebraska College of Agriculture. There have now been 3,380

individuals elected to membership in our Nebraska Chapter since the chapter was chartered May 25, 1918.
