### IN MEMORIAM

The Nebraska Chapter of Gamma Sigma Delta recognizes the lifetime achievements of the following members who have died since the last newsletter was published.

Archie W. White of Fremont died October 27, 2001. He was initiated into the Nebraska Chapter as a senior in Animal Husbandry on May 12, 1949. Archie was a livestock specialist for George A. Hormel Packing Company until his retirement. He was the University of Nebraska Block and Bridle Club honoree in 1976.

Urban E. Wendorff died January 12, 2002. He was initiated into the Nebraska Chapter as a vocational agriculture education faculty member on May 17, 1954. He was a professor of agricultural engineering and agricultural education at the University of Nebraska and taught vocational agriculture education for more than 25 years. Before working at the University he taught vocational agriculture in Broken Bow and Tecumseh for 12 years and was assistant state supervisor in the state Department of Education for two years. "Urb" was Nebraska Chapter President in 1969 and received the Chapter's Teaching Award of Merit in 1970.
