FOREWARD

In keeping with the responsibility of the Department of Agricultural Education, University of Nebraska, Lincoln for stimulating, facilitating and maintaining vocational education in agriculture across Nebraska, and its commitment to inform all who have interest or need to know the current "state of the art," this publication has been developed and distributed. It evolved from a recognized need for a "benchmark" of past and present from which to peer back as well as to project into the future relative to efforts and accomplishments.

This report should aid practitioners and administrators in assessing the current state of the art in the field of agriculture in Nebraska. Further, it should assist in identifying voids in our present framework and help to sharpen the focus on needs, efforts and future plans. It is logical to assume that this summary should assist also in accelerating the applications of improved information to current practices in vocational education in agriculture.

Historical investigation, the accounting and ordering of facts, is vital to the extent that it leads toward the interpretation of past events, implications of present circumstances and future improvement. It is valuable to establish causes for educational events, to show trends and to make program comparisons periodically.

Principles guiding the historical investigator are: to establish reasonable delimitations on the problem and work on materials with which he has a considerable degree of familiarity; do wide reading to set up the background; and present the systemized facts in a readable form. It is recognized that no simple, short report can be all comprehensive--gaps will appear. Nonetheless, Professor Marion Garfield McCreight has met each of the above criteria in an exemplary manner. We are indebted to Professor McCreight for his meticulous manner of scholarship in a splendid job of "pulling together" significant facts and of providing this "benchmark" following more than half a century of Federally-funded Vocational Agricultural Education in Nebraska.

Only a person with a deep dedication to the profession and sincere personal interest in individuals within the profession could write such a history. "Mac" is such a person. Although he grew up in the era of the beginning of vocational education in the public schools, years alone do not qualify one to write history.

Over and above the commendation to Professor McCreight for this publication, it is the desire of the staff in the Department of Agricultural Education to acknowledge that he has, for more than one third of a century, rendered signal service to agricultural education. Both as a high school and as a college teacher he has been a vital link in the chain connecting new knowledge at the College of Agriculture to its application on the farms and ranches of the state. He has dedicated his entire professional life and energies to that noble cause, the improvement of rural life. Through the years, hundreds of farmers and those who work with farmers have received inspiration as well as information from "Mac," an agriculturalist, a teacher and a gentle-man. It follows his well established pattern of excellence in organization, methodology and writing.

The purpose of this publication is to present a history of Agricultural Education at the secondary school level in Nebraska. Attention is called to efforts of the State of Nebraska to implement instruction at the secondary level prior to the beginning of and during the early years of the twentieth century. These efforts laid the foundation for the State to be readily acceptable to vocational agriculture programs made possible by the passage of the Smith-Hughes Act by the Congress of the United States in 1917.

The author has been a part of the Vocational Agricultural Program in Nebraska since 1938. He personally knew some of the teachers of vocational agriculture who graduated as early as 1922 and 1923. The writer attended Young Farmer and Adult Farmer classes before entering the field of Agricultural Education. He has attended all NVAA Conferences beginning in 1938 except one. It has been a rare privilege to have worked with so many outstanding men in the field of Agricultural Education at the secondary level.

AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION IN THE SECONDARY SCHOOLS OF NEBRASKA PRIOR TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE

Nebraska became a state in 1867. Five years later, in 1872, the College of Agriculture was established, and in 1895 the school of agriculture at the secondary school level was opened on the College of Agriculture campus. The school of agriculture offered a three year course of six months duraation per year. Professor. A. E. Davisson was the first principal of the school of agriculture (1895-1911). Fifteen years later, in 1910, a fourth-year course was added. As a result, the school of agriculture became an approved high school. Fred Hunter served as principal for one year, 1911-1912. Professor Harry E. Bradford followed Fred Hunter and served as principal until 1930 when the school of agriculture on the College of Agriculture campus was closed.

A second State School of Agriculture at the secondary level opened its doors in 1913, at Curtis, Nebraska, following an appropriation of one hundred thousand dollars by the Nebraska Legislature in 1911. This school continued to operate through the school year 1967-68 when it was closed as a secondary level school.

The Nebraska Legislature in 1912 passed the Shumway Act providing funds to aid schools in teaching agriculture, manual training, and home economics. This appropriation amounted to \$15,000. The most a single school could receive was \$1250. This Program was under the supervision of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. Teachers of Agriculture under this act were to be approved by the Dean of the College of Agriculture. Harry E. Bradford supervised the agriculture courses. A supervised experience program of sort was part of the Program (a five acre tract of land was required for each school). Since the instructor was on a nine month appointment, there was no supervision during the summer, and the supervised experience program was neglected. The program soon fell by the wayside and appropriations were cut off by the 1914-1916 Legislature.

A second attempt was made by the Nebraska State Legislature in 1915 to encourage schools to include vocational education in their curricula by the passage of the Mallery Act. Small sums of money were to be paid annually to schools for participation. The Mallery Act made the following provisions:

The State Board of Education is hereby authorized to draw warrants on the State Treasurer against the funds appropriated by the state for such sums as are necessary to be expended in order to comply with the provisions of any Federal Statute enacted for the national aid for vocational education. (1)

The amount of money to be paid to a school was based on the following statements found in the Mallery Act: Rural and Consolidated districts maintaining tworoom school buildings, employing certified teachers

and providing suitable equipment for the teaching of agriculture, home economics and other industrial and vocational subjects shall be paid the sum of \$100 toward the cost of equipment required and the further sum of \$150 annually. Districts maintaining three-room buildings shall be paid \$150 toward the cost of equipment and the further sum of \$200; districts maintaining four-room buildings shall be paid \$250 to apply on the cost of equipment and further the sum of \$300. All sums specified shall be paid annually. (2) (3)

VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE AT THE SECONDARY SCHOOL LEVEL

The United. States Congress initiated Federal policy in 1917 by passing the Smith-Hughes Act. The Legislation was introduced by Senator Hoke Smith and Representative D. M. Hughes, both Congressmen from the state of Georgia. ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION OF VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE

The Nebraska State Legislature passed House Roll 800 accepting the Smith-Hughes Act. It was signed by Governor Neville on April 25, 1917. One of the requirements to be eligible for federal funds was the formation of a State Board for Vocational Education. All board members names were taken from Educational Directories of the State of Nebraska. (4)

TEACHER EDUCATION IN VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE

Since there were no teachers prepared specifically to teach Vocational Agriculture in the secondary schools of Nebraska this task was assigned to the University of Nebracka, College of Agriculture. The first teachers qualified in Nebraska to teach Vocational Agriculture graduated from the University in 1920. Seven new Vocational Agriculture teachers graduated in that year. All except one taught Vo-Ag in Nebraska. One of those graduating, Byron J. McMahon, who taught at Eagle and was a supervising instructor, later became Chief of Agricultural Education of the State of California.

THE GROWTH OF VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE

DEPARTMENTS IN NEBRASKA

Vocational Agriculture had its beginning in a small way with only two departments, Hastings and Scottsbluff, which opened in 1917-1918 with a total enrollment of 76 students. The growth in number of departments is indicated in Table I. It can be noted, beginning in 1942-1943, that there was a drop in the number of departments as many Vo-Ag teachers were drafted into the service during World War II. From 115 departments in 1941-1942, the number dropped to 69 in 1945-1946. By 1955-1956, however, the number had increased to 150. In 1972-1973 there were 131 departments employing 147 vocational agriculture teachers.

Several factors are involved in the number of departments rising to 150 by 1955-56:

-following World War II agriculture was prospering -prices for raw agriculture products were good -efficiency of production agriculture was on the increase -the foreign market for agricultural products was rising

- -institutional-on-the-farm training had reached its peak enrollment
- -many small schools included vocational agriculture in their curriculum

The reduction in number of vocational agriculture departments following the peak in 1955-1956 was due partially to the following factors:

-school redistricting -fewer farmers and ranchers needed -school administrators and boards of education of some larger school felt there was no need for vocational agriculture -poor vocational agriculture programs

Of the 131 schools including vocational agriculture in their curriculum in 1972-1973, 14 have two teacher departments. Multiple teacher departments have been made possible by broadening offerings in vocational agriculture classes. Such broadening of the offerings has also caused an increase in the enrollment in vocational agriculture. As noted in Table I, the enrollment increased from 5097 in 1966-67 to 7858 in 1972-73. Such increases are a direct result of the passage of the National Vocational Education Acts of 1963 and 1968 and their amendments.

The intent of the Smith-Hughes Act of 1917 was to train present and prospective farmers in Production Agriculture. This was done until the passage of the Vocational Acts of 1963 and 1968 and their amendments which permitted a broadening of the vocational education program to include courses to prepare or upgrade persons for employment in:

Agricultural Supplies and Services (10)

Those businesses which provide supplies to farmers and ranchers and provide services needed to use these supplies. (e.g., Feed Store, Fertilizer Plant) Agricultural Mechanics (10)

Busineses which sell and service agricultural power units, machinery and related equipment. (e.g., Farm Implement Dealer, Agricultural Mechanic Shop)

Agricultural Products (10)

Businesses which assemble, sort, test, grade, store, and market farm and ranch products. (e.g., Elevator, Feed Mill, Dairy Processing Plant) Ornamental Horticulture (10)

Businesses which process, distribute and utilize ornamental crops principally for ornamental or aesthetic purposes. (e.g., Nursery, Landscaping, Lawn and Turf Management)

Agricultural Resources (10)

Businesses concerned with the principles and practices necessary to conserve and improve the natural resources. (e.g., ASCS, SCS, FHA Banks)

Forestry (10)

Businesses involved in the production, processing, management, maketing and utilization of forest products. (e.g., Tree Farm, Sawmill, Wood Product Plant) This broadened program no doubt had a great affect on increasing the day school enrollment in Vocational Agriculture as evidenced in Table I. In 1962-63, the enrollment was 4887, as compared to 7858 in 1972-73.

Reviewing the first five years of vocational agriculture, 1917-18 through 1921-22, it was found that of the 43 public schools which had established departments of Vocational Agriculture, only 31 were in operation during the fifth year (1921-22) following the passage of the Smith-Hughes Act.

Of the 43 Vocational Agriculture Departments established during the five year period 1917-22, 21 departments were in operation during 1972-73. They are listed below:

VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE JUDGING CONTESTS

State Level Contests

The first Nebraska Public High School Vocational Agriculture Contest was held on the College of Agriculture Campus in 1918 when Professor Howard Gramlich, Chairman of the Department of Animal Husbandry in the College of Agriculture, extended an invitation to the departments of Vocational Agriculture that were located near Lincoln. Since then, these contests have been an annual event on East Campus. The initial Contest consisted only of livestock judging.

Approximately 50-60 students were in attendance at the first contest. Professor C. C. Minteer directed the contests from their inception in 1918 until 1950 when Dr. H. W. Deems assumed this responsibility. Professor M. G. McCreight became coordinator of the contests in 1951 and continued in that capacity through 1973.

Shortly after the beginning of the livestock judging contests at the state level, other departments on the campus became interested in conducting contests. In 1973 contests conducted on East Campus were:

Animal Science Department Livestock Selection Livestock Management Dairy Cattle Selection Meats Judging & Identification Poultry Department Poultry Judging, Management Practices, and Egg Quality

Agronomy Department Agronomy Contest

Food Technology Quality Milk and Dairy Foods Agricultural Engineering Dept. Horticulture Dept. Metals Horticulture Farm Machinery (General) Farm Wiring Agricultural Mechanics Soil Conservation Tractor Maintenance

Agricultural Economics Dept. Farm Management

An Agricultural Mechanics Contest was added in 1973 to select a team to enter National Competition.

Two contests, Babcock Testing of Dairy Products and Farm Carpentry, have been discontinued.

Six to seven hundred students were involved in the contests during the early 1940's. This number has risen to 1,800 in the late sixties and early seventies.

In 1970, the state level of Vocational Agriculture judging contests became the joint responsibility of Resident Instruction and Agricultural Extension through a committee appointed by the Dean of the College and chaired by the contest coordinator. Prior to 1970, the contests were the responsibility of the Department of Agricultural Education, University of Nebraska at Lincoln.

District Level Contests

Nebraska is divided into eight districts by the State Department of Education and Nebraska Vocational Agriculture Association for administrative purposes. Each of the eight districts hold contests for practice and/or elimination in preparation for the state level contests. CONTINUING EDUCATION IN VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE

Vocational Agriculture has been made available to persons who have or have not completed high school and who are farming, ranching, or engaged as an owner or employed in an agribusiness. Such programs are known as:

Young Farmer Classes

Adult Farmer Classes

Out of School Rural Youth and Adults (OSYA) Food Production War Training Classes (FPWT) Institutional on the Farm Training (IOF) School Community Food Preservation Program Farm Management Classes

Adult Off-Farm Agricultural Occupations Classes (OFAO) Veterans Classes

A short explanation of each of the above programs follows: Young Farmer Classes

This group is generally thought of as being between the ages of 16 and 25 and becoming established in farming or ranching. Each young farmer conducts an experience program under the supervision of a vocational agriculture instructor.

Young Farmer Classes were conducted in Nebraska as early as 1925-26 at Hooper, Nebraska. Seven additional schools first offered young farmer classes between 1926 and 1928. All of these schools maintained a department of vocational agriculture in 1972-73. From 1925 to 1972, 1205 young farmer classes with a total enrollment of 19,026 were conducted in 160 different schools. The largest enrollment in young farmer classes in any one school in a single year was 94 at West Point, Nebraska during the year 1935-36. The Vocational Agriculture instructor was Richard M. Kildee, now deceased.

Adult Farm Classes

This group of operators includes those generally established in farming or ranching as renters, renter-owners, or as owners. Instruction has been offered in the Vocational Agriculture Departments as well as in communities surrounding the town in which the Vocational Agriculture Department is located. Meetings were held by the local Vo-Ag teacher or another qualified person. Sessions were often held in nearby towns or rural schools to accomodate the adults.

The first schools to conduct adult farmer classes in Nebraska were Filley, Friend, Stapleton and York in 1922-23. The Vo-Ag instructors respectively were L. B. Snyder, Clifford Girardot, F. H. Beedle and R. L. Clark. At the close of the 1925-26 school year, 23 Vocational Agriculture Departments had conducted an adult farmer class. Of these 23, only 13 or 56 percent maintained a department of Vocational Agriculture in 1972-73.

From 1922-1972, 1829 adult classes with a total enrollment of 32,536 were conducted in 180 different schools.

The largest enrollment in an adult farmer class in any one Vocational Agriculture department in a single year was 311 at Scotia in the year 1923-24. This enrollment included both men and women. The Vo-Ag teacher was G. Edward Scheidt. Out-of-School Rural Youth and Adults (OSYA)

The OSYA program began in Nebraska in 1941. Its purpose was to educate out of school youth and adults in the areas of gardening, farm machinery and power operation and maintenance, to support the World War II effort. Most of the manufacturing industry was heavily engaged in producing military equipment. It was necessary for farmers and ranchers to utilize the equipment they had to maximize production from their operations. Much effort was spent in this direction. Old equipment was repaired and single row units were combined into multiple row equipment. Neither labor nor new equipment was available for purchase to operate the farms and ranches. Many families who had not had a garden for a period of years were again producing vegetables for the table and home consumption. No records were available as to the number of courses offered. Food Production War Training Courses (FPWT)

This program, which began in 1942, was an extension of the OSYA program. It continued until 1945, when Federal Funds were cut off immediately by the President of the United States because World War II had ended.

Seventy-two schools conducted 624 FPWT courses from 1943-45. More courses would have been conducted had it not been for a number of Vo-Ag teachers being drafted into the service.

The number of Vocational Agriculture departments had risen from 115 in 1941-42 and had dropped to 69 by 1945-56, the year that World Wat II ended. Most of the men who were qualifying for teaching Vo-Ag during the war period were being drafted upon graduation. In 1945, only two men were qualified in Nebraska for teaching Vocational Agriculture.

Institutional On The Farm Training (IOF)

This program had its beginning in 1946-47 with only four classes in operation. It was made possible by the 78th Congress passing in 1944, Public Law 346, the Serviceman's Readjustment Act, and provided for payments to veterans living on and operating farms. Instructors, mostly College of Agriculture graduates, were hired to teach these classes. This program provided for 200 hours of group instruction and 100 hours of individual on-farm instruction per year, and was continued for veterans returning from the Korean War.

The enrollment in this program reached a peak in 1950-51 with 287 classes and an enrollment of 9,315 veterans. The last class was closed out April 30, 1962.

Table II reveals the size of the IOF Program.*

School Community Food Preservation Program

The Food Preservation program was designed to produce and preserve the home food supply in order to free more of the commercial production for military use and to help feed nations heavily engaged in war activities on both the European and Pacific Theatres of operations. This program was associated with and directed through the state department of vocational agriculture. Federal funds were provided for the purchase of the equipment to establish centers in facilities provided by the local boards of education.

Only one food preservaton center associated with the above department was located in Lincoln, Nebraska in the Bryant School Building. The building is no longer standing. This program was under the supervision of L. H. Alberty of the Lincoln Public School and managed by Mrs. W.E. Lyness. The program in Lincoln was in operation from 1943 until 1951. This center was established as a demonstration center for other schools to follow. The War ended before the other centers could be developed.

During the height of the war many FFA Chapters near the city of Lincoln donated and delivered several truck loads of garden produce, and helped prepare the produce for canning and shipment overseas.

Farm Management Classes

These classes began in the fall of 1961 and were known as "The Nebraska Electronic Farm Record Project" commonly referred to as "Neb. Farm" It was a cooperative effort of Vocational Agriculture and the Agriculture Extension Service to:

Help farmers and ranchers with their business records Provide them with a farm business analysis Give them advice and counsel on farm and ranch problems Assist them in planning and organizing their farm and ranch business.

No record of the number of classes or cooperators attending classes in Vocational Agriculture Departments was available from 1961-64. The program continued for another two years, 1964-66, then was discontinued until 1969. The program was again started in 1969-70 and was known as "Farm Business Management." A staff member was added to the Department of Agricultural Education, University of Nebraska-Lincoln to work with Voctional Agriculture teachers in moving the program forward.

The number of classes held in Nebraska from 1969-73 as reported by the State Department of Vocational Education Agricultural Division is shown below:

These classes are designed for persons who are preparing to enter or have already entered the labor market and who need training or retraining in off-farm agricultural occupations to achieve stability or advancement in their occupational choice.

AGRICULTURAL ORGANIZATIONS ASSOCIATED WITH VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE IN NEBRASKA

The Future Farmers of America (FFA)

The National FFA Organization held its first convention in November, 1928 in the Baltimore Hotel in Kansas City, Missouri. Nebraska was one of the original 18 states at this first convention. Alvin Reimer of DeWitt, Nebraska and from the Beatrice Vo-Ag Department was named Central Regional Vice President. The first two chapters in Nebraska were chartered in November, 1928 at Beatrice and Eagle. The State association of the Future Farmers of Nebraska has issued 198 local charters from 1928-1973. There are, at this writing, 131 active FFA chapters in Nebraska.

The Young Farmers Education Association (YFEA)

The Nebraska Young Farmers Education Association had its beginning in 1962. A total of 39 chapters have been chartered. At this writing, 23 local chapters remain active. The first president of the state association was Marvin Schultis of the Fairbury Chapter.

VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE DEPARTMENTS IN NEBRASKA

AND TENURE OF TEACHERS EMPLOYED

A total of 219 schools in Nebraska have had Vocational Agriculture. At the time of this writing, 1972-73, 131 schools have a department of Vocational Agriculture.
