Nichols wins annual Rose Frolik award

Susan Nichols, project assistant with the Office of Extended Education and Outreach, was named the 2004 winner of the Rose Frolik award presented by the University of Nebraska Office Personnel Association. The award is named for the organization's founder;

Frolik was the guest of honor at the April 13 presentation. The award has been presented annually since 1989.

Nichols' nominator, Randy Leach, director of business operations for Extended Education and Outreach, said, "Among her accomplishments is the total service attitude that she conveys when working with others. She approaches each responsibility with enthusiasm and a high degree of caring that sets her apart."

Nichols worked in the Division of Continuing Studies and continued to maintain her positive attitude and sense

of humor during the organization's reorganization, downsizing and move, Leach said.

"In her life and her work, she sets high standards for herself, has a personal commitment to doing what is 'right,' not just expedient, believes that honesty really is the best policy, and always recognizes that she will need to keep actively learning throughout her lifetime," Leach said.

One letter of support read, "The leadership, professionalism and personal character of the nominee clearly contribute to the positive attitude and

increased performance of co-workers, as well as the performances of the organization as a whole."

For winning the Rose Frolik award, Nichols received an engraved plaque, a \$300 award and a one-year membership to UNOPA.

At the April meeting, members have traditionally recognized UNOPA past presidents and retirees and the winner of the Rose Frolik Award. Sixteen past presidents and one retiree attended.
