There have been 3,143 members elected to membership in our Nebraska Chapter in the last 76 years. This brings the total initiated into all of the 47 chapters to well over 84,700.

We wish to thank you for the fine response to our 1995 dues notice. If you haven't sent in your \$10 payment yet, try to get it to me at A213 Animal Sciences, P.O. Box 830908, Lincoln, NE 68583-0908 before March 31, 1995. Any time you change your address, please let me know and we will correct it for our future mailings. The Post Office doesn't do too good a job of forwarding mail and their forwarding time limit is very short. Also, please let us know the names and addresses of other GSD members who have moved to Nebraska so we can invite them to become active in our chapter. We wish to thank those of you who have transferred your membership to our chapter.

Since our August 1994 NEWSLETTER the following six GSD members have died. Dr. Galen W. Dodge, initiated as an Agricultural Education faculty member November 20, 1988, died November 1, 1994 as an inactive member. T.A. "Al" Evans, initiated as a Dairy Science faculty member May 18, 1965, died August 29, 1994 as an active member. He was serving as the Acting Chairman of the Dairy Science Department when it became a part of the Animal Science Department January 30, 1968. He also served as the Acting Chairman of the Food Science and Technology Department during 1973. Earl W. Gleaves, who was also initiated May 18, 1965 as a Poultry Extension Specialist and had received our Extension Award of Merit in 1984, died January 23, 1995 as an inactive member. Marvin W. Hoffman, former Otoe County Agricultural Agent initiated May 10, 1957 and still an active member, died December 13, 1994. Dr. Norman W. Kruse, initiated as an alumnus November 18, 1979, was a former Nebraska State Veterinarian who died December 10, 1994 as an inactive member. Clare R. Porter, initiated in 1937 by the Kansas Beta Chapter of Gamma Sigma Delta, transferred to Nebraska as a crop improvement specialist and later helped establish NC+ Hybrids. Mr. Porter received our chapter's Award of Merit for Distinguished Service to Agriculture in 1972 and served as the first president of Agricultural Builders of Nebraska, Inc from 1970 to 1975. Agricultural Builders was one of the chief organizations that helped establish the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources at UNL. He was an inactive member when he died on September 7, 1994. Please let me know of any other Gamma Sigma Delta members who have died and not been listed in one of our NEWSLETTERS.
