## Features

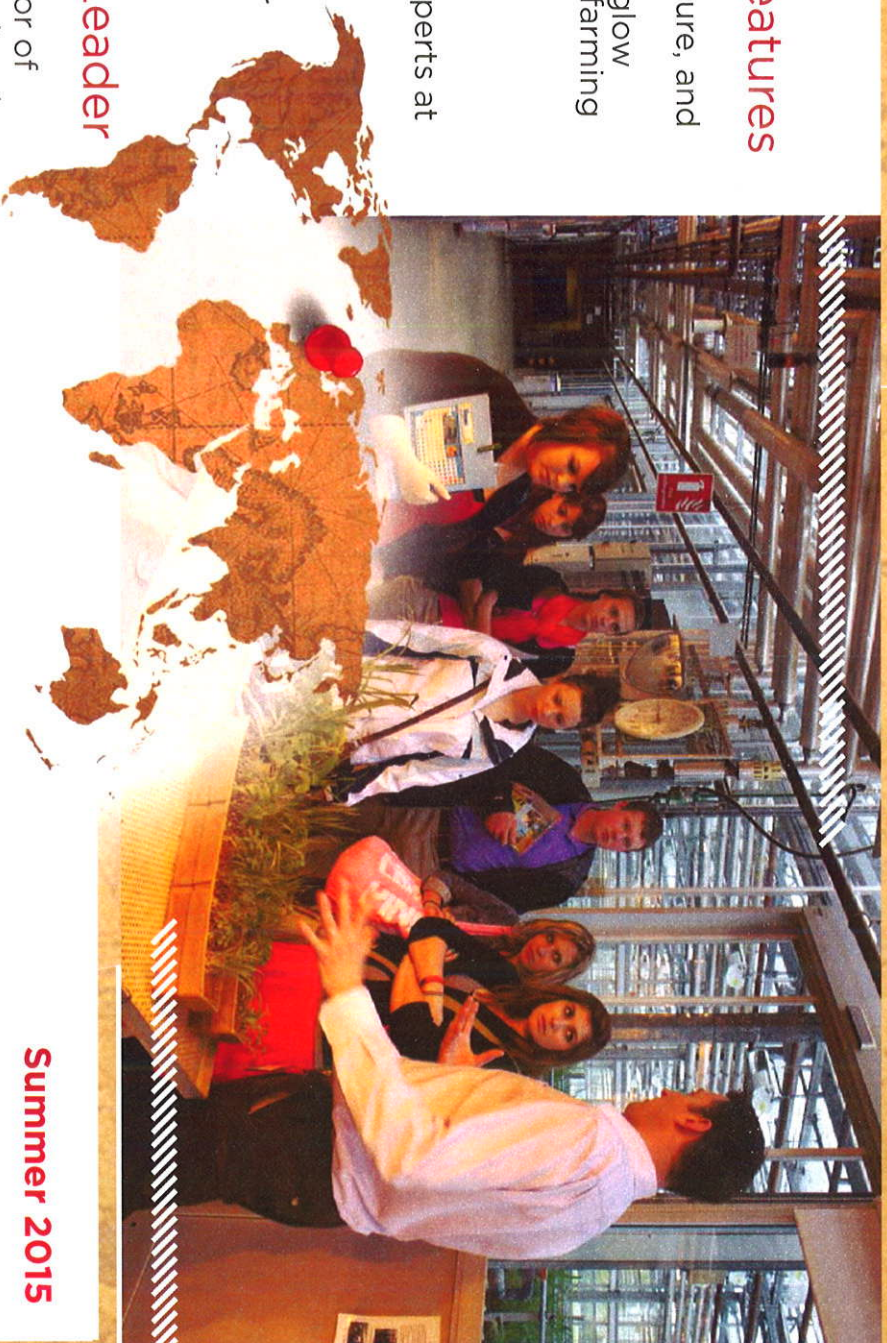
- Become familiar with British history, culture, and tradition

## Faculty Program Leader
