Todd T. Gleeson, Dean, College of Arts and Sciences.

Dean Gleeson earned a doctorate from the University of California, Irvine in developmental and cell biology in 1979, and has been a member of the Boulder faculty since 1981. He is a professor in the Department of Integrative Physiology, and maintains a research laboratory that has trained numerous undergraduates and 20 graduate students and postdoctoral associates. He earned Boulder campus Student Office of Alumni Relations (SOAR) teaching-honors in 1985. He has published over 100 articles and abstracts on his studies of muscle carbohydrate metabolism and the metabolic consequences of muscle-fatigue in animals, and he is an elected fellow of the AAAS. He served as Associate Vice Chancellor for Faculty Affairs on the Boulder campus from 1997-2001, and has served as dean of the College since 2001. The College of Arts and Sciences, founded in 1892, is the oldest and largest college on the Boulder

campus and is the home to over 800 faculty and 19,000 students.

Dean Gleeson is an advisory board member of the Boulder campus ADVANCE grant program entitled: "LEAP" (Leadership Education for Advancement and Promotion) which has goals of "increasing" representation of women in science, math, and engineering disciplines, and "encouraging" the number of women in leadership roles.
