Government Documents and the Center for Digital Research in the Humanities at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Libraries are pleased to announce the release of a World Wide Web site, entitled *You say cranberry and I say cramberry, let's call the whole thing off: A lexicon of the recognized American Indian treaties*.

This site provides access to a description of TokenX, a text visualization and analysis tool that expedites the examination of digital documents, and to derived lexicon lists – ordered alphabetically and by frequency – for the texts of the 375 acknowledged American Indian treaties created with the British and the federal governments.

We hope that this effort will stimulate others to deploy TokenX in their domains of text analysis, and that our lexicon will serve as an aid to the study of these transactions with the tribes. We welcome your comments, as well as your error reports.
