
. Children may encounter speech delays, [causing] bilingual children [to] develop speech at a slower rate than their monolingual peers (Pittman, 2015, p. 5).

. As children are exposed to a different language with their friends at school they often start to show a preference for that language which could cause the child to begin speaking it at home more than the first language (Pittman, 2015, p. 6).
