Faculty News

The 7th annual *Bug Bash*, held September 17 - 20, 2003, exceeded past attendance records once more. Over 2,100 students attended the Wednesday - Friday sessions and a record 2,200 people came to the open session on Saturday. 78 Science Focus High School students, along with 75 UNL undergraduate students enrolled in Insect Biology, and 16 home-schooled students were trained to present information to young learners and the public. 34 UNL faculty, staff, and graduate students, and 16 adult contributors from the community trained presenters and managed teaching stations. New DUNS # Required on Federal Grant Applications Beginning 10/1/2003

All Federal grant applications and cooperative agreements will require a DUNS # effective 10/1/2003. The correct number to use for the University of Nebraska-Lincoln is 55-545-6995. Please contact Lynne Smejdir, in Ag Finance and Personnel, 2-1455 or Ismejdir1@unl.edu with any questions.

Reminder: When planning your end of year vacation usage, please remember that you will be required to use **two days** of vacation for the Holiday Closedown. One day will be posted during the shutdown this calendar year (before 12/31/2003), and will be subtracted from the 2003 balance. The other will be posted just after the start of the new year (on 01/02/2004), and will be subtracted from the 2004 balance. The timing shouldn't affect most people, but since two days are being used over the closedown this year, please plan accordingly. Contact Marilyn or Allen if you have questions.

Search Committee Certification is required prior to serving on a search committee and for <u>anyone doing job interviews for permanent staff position</u>. Certification is obtained by attending a briefing session. Certification is good for two years. Non Resident Alien student employees must notify both Registration & Records as well as the Department Office when they receive their permanent Social Security Number.

A permanent Social Security Number is required to process a Non Resident Alien PAF in November and December. The reason is that it usually takes 30-60 days to receive a permanent number and UNL can not have temporary IDs appear on W2 year-end files to the IRS. A student, who is a Non Resident Alien, cannot be hired in November/December unless he/she has a SSN number.

W2s will be mailed in January. Please be sure that the University has your correct address. See the Department Office ASAP if you need to make an update. DO NOT update your address on the ESS system.
