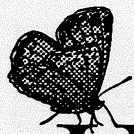

■ Mastercard Purchases @ Super Saver

Do NOT use Mastercard at Super Saver! They keep the itemized receipt for their records, consequently the department is missing the only verifiable document of the actual items purchased. We've also had multiple problems with sales tax being charged when using Mastercard. If you wish to make purchases at Super Saver you will need to: 1) request a QL prior to purchase or 2) you may make the purchase at your own expense and request reimbursement of your itemized receipt.

■ Images II Purchases

Images II has informed the department that some Entomology students are wanting to charge their services and have Images II invoice the department. This is unacceptable as the department does not have a Blanket Order at Images II. Faculty, staff and students who wish to make purchases at Images II have 3 purchase options: 1) University Mastercard, 2) QL's, and 3) Request Reimbursement for Out-of-Pocket Purchase.
