Seed Sources for Commercial Vegetable Production

Cultivars appropriate for commercial production and shipping may differ significantly from those for home gardens. Farmers' market and direct sales may utilize cultivars from either or both categories. The suppliers listed may or may not sell seed in volumes appropriate to smaller acreages. Some primary suppliers only sell seed by the pound, which may contain more than 110,000 seeds in the case of onions, lettuce or cabbages. Distributors (dealers) frequently handle a wide selection of cultivars developed by different primary sources. They also are more likely to sell smaller units. If a cultivar is not listed in the catalog but cultivars from the same primary source as the cultivar you want are listed, the distributor may be able to order the seed for you. Additional mail-order seed sources are found in NebFact 92-80, *General and Specialty Mail-Order Seed Sources*.
