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Annual Flowers for Specific Uses in Nebraska

Annual flowers grow from seed, come into flower and die in a single growing season. The following lists of annual flowers are grouped for specific uses in Nebraska. Common names are listed first, followed by scientific names.

Annuals for Poor Soils

These plants will flower satisfactorily where soils are low in nutrients and organic matter:

- Coreopsis (*Coreopsis tinctoria*)
- Cornflower (*Centaurea cyanus*)
- Four-O'clock (*Mirabilis jalapa*)
- Moss Rose (*Portulaca grandiflora*)
- Nasturtium (*Tropaeolum majus*)
- Spider Flower (*Cleome spinosa*)

Annuals for Hot, Dry Regions

Heat and drought are not ideal for these flowers, but they continue to bloom satisfactorily if soil and other factors are normal and a minimum amount of moisture is available to the plant.

Annuals for Edging

Edging plants are low growing plants used to edge patios, walks, shrub borders and perennial borders. They also can be planted in the foreground of annual flower beds.

Annuals to Use in Dried Arrangements

Certain annual flowers can be preserved by drying. These are commonly called "everlastings."

Annuals for Moist, Well-drained Soils

Use these annuals where the soil remains damp continuously.

- Annual Woodruff (*Asperula orientalis*)
- Balsam (*Impatiens balsamina*)
- Bugloss (*Anchusa capensis*)

- Dahlia (*Dahlia X hybrid*)
- Forget-Me-Not (*Myosotis sylvatica*)
- Globe Candytuft (*Iberis umbellata*)
- Monkey Flower (*Mimulus, hybrids*)
- Nicotiana, Flowering Tobacco (*Nicotiana alata*)
- Pansy (*Viola spp.*)

Annuals that will Self-Seed

These annuals tend to reproduce from previous years' seed without the need to replant each year:

- Bachelor's-buttons (*Centaurea cyanus*)
- Hollyhock (*Alcea rosea*)
- Moss Rose (*Portulaca grandiflora*)

Annuals that Produce Colorful Fruit

A few annuals, although not considered a flower, have colorful fruit.

- Ornamental Gourds
- Ornamental Pepper (*Capsicum annuum*)

Annuals for Amusement

Some plants have special features which may not have great ornamental value but which are unique for one or more traits.

- Sensitive Plant (*Mimosa pudica*)

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
