## On-line Studies on Nebraska Ornithology by P. A. Johnsgard

In recent years the University of Nebraska has been developing a Digital Commons internet library (<http://digitalcommons.unl.edu/>) that is freely available on-line, and that includes publications in the humanities and sciences. The Digital Commons is a national on-line digital library that serves as a repository for scholarly publishing. It is a collection of a university's scholarly effort that preserves and makes accessible information via the internet that is produced by that institution. It may include preliminary or final copies of journal articles, theses, dissertations, conference proceedings, books or other scholarly materials. The University of Nebraska has been an active participant in this national effort, and its digital holdings are among the largest in the country. Specific titles may easily be found through the usual search engines, such as Google. The University of Nebraska's facility (the Center for Digital Research in the Humanities) is located in Love Library on Lincoln's city campus.

Over 40 of my publications that are no longer easily available as hard copies can be freely accessed through UN-L's Digital Commons. The list below is limited to those titles that variously relate to the birds of Nebraska and were entirely or in part written by me. They can be assessed at the URLs indicated.
