## CALL FOR PAPERS

The Mari Sandoz Heritage Society Annual Meeting and Conference will be held March 26-28, 2009 at The Mari Sandoz High Plains Heritage Center, Chadron State College, Chadron, Nebraska. The topic of this year's conference is *Mari Sandoz and Her Literary Contemporaries*. Proposals for papers on Mari Sandoz's works are invited for presentation on Friday, March 27, 2009. We are especially interested in papers dealing with Sandoz and her literary contemporaries from the High Plains, such as John Neihardt, Bess Streeter Aldrich, Weldon Kees, Angie Debo, Wright Morris, Willa Cather, and others. However, presentations focusing exclusively on the Sandoz works will be considered as well. We also welcome submissions concerned with Wright Morris's literary works and/or photography since there will be a special exhibit of Morris's photographs at the Mari Sandoz Heritage Center. The keynote speaker for the conference will be Dr. Joseph J. "Joe" Wydeven. Dr. Wydeven is an expert on Nebraska literature and Nebraska authors, particularly on the novelist and photographer Wright Morris.
