2020-2021 Christmas Bird Counts

Fourteen counts were run during the 2020-2021 CBC season, ten of which were run in the period December 14 through December 22. The other four were done December 28 or later. The weather was generally cooperative with little snow cover and some open water. While there were no weather issues that resulted in cancellation or postponement, four counts, Crawford, Harrison, Harlan County, and Omaha, were cancelled over concerns for the Covid situation.

It would be expected that running fewer counts would have a noticeable negative impact on this year's species count and overall numbers. The Harrison and Crawford counts usually produce some good western species although not in huge numbers. With the revival of the Harlan count in recent years, it has become a very productive circle for both waterfowl and land birds. The Omaha count had not been cancelled before in any of the years that this analysis covers going back to 1963, and it has consistently provided good numbers for the species expected along the Missouri River in the eastern end of the state. It is somewhat surprising that this year's total of 136 species is close to the ten-year average. However, the total number of individual birds, 174,549, was the lowest number since 2009, a year which had many weather issues and only fourteen counts completed.

Twenty-one species were found in all circles, compared to four last year. This is probably the only positive aspect of having four counts cancelled. Twenty-eight species were found in only one circle and thirteen of those were single birds. Eight species set new high counts including the first ever two Lesser Goldfinch which were found at Lake McConaughy.

Twenty-five species of Anseriformes were counted with mostly unremarkable tallies. One exception was Greater White-fronted Goose which set a new high count for the third year in a row. This year's total of 3,084 handily beats last year's count of 1223. The bulk of this year's "speckle-bellies" (2972) were found at DeSoto-Boyer on December 19.

While Galliformes, grebes, and most of the Columbiformes numbers were nothing out of the ordinary, the 596 Mourning Doves counted were second only to the high count of 612 from 2016, and mostly likely would have set a new high if all of the counts had been done.

The 12 Virginia Rails, all found at Lake McConaughy, beat the old high count of 11 from the same circle in 2017 and were one of the highlights for water-related species. Other than Killdeer and Wilson's Snipe, which were found in typical numbers, no other shorebirds were counted. There were eight gull species with no surprising species or numbers.

Diurnal raptors also produced little in the way of noteworthy numbers. The count of 42 Northern Harriers is the lowest since 2009 when 31 were counted, and the 16 Sharp-shinned Hawks is the lowest count since 1997 when only 13 were tallied. On the nocturnal side, the 27 Barred Owls tied with the previous two years for high count honors.

Without the Omaha and Harlan County counts to pad their totals, woodpecker numbers were generally below average. The Northern Flicker tally of 246 was the lowest since 229 were counted in 1998. Seven Pileated Woodpeckers were counted with 4 found at DeSoto and 3 at Indian Cave. In the last 5 years, Omaha has averaged 5 Pileated Woodpeckers per year, and the average for all counts has been 9.

Even with four counts missing, for the second consecutive year Blue Jays set a new high count. This year's total of 1,565 easily topped the 2019 tally of 1,371. On the other hand, Black-billed Magpies continue to do poorly. This year's total of 28 ranks as fourth lowest.

Black-capped Chickadee numbers fared better than in recent years even with the absence of the Omaha circle to pad the numbers. The total of 1,004 is the best since 1,135 were found in 2012. Some other dicky birds also did well. Red-breasted Nuthatches had the third highest count and White-breasted Nuthatches had the fifth highest count. Winter Wrens set a new high count of 14, seven of which were counted in the Branched Oak circle; the old high count was 11 found in 2010.

A couple of the thrushes produced numbers on the low side. For the last decade Eastern Bluebird numbers have ranged from 466 to 637 birds per year. This year only 167 were counted, which is the lowest count since only 152 were found in 2004. American Robin numbers were also below average with the lowest count (2160) since 1994 when only 574 were found. The numbers were consistently low along the eastern end of the state with a total of only 46 robins found in the Ames, DeSoto, Indian Cave and Lower Platte counts combined.

For those of you who have been wondering which circle has produced the most White-winged Crossbills over the years, the answer is Norfolk. This circle produced all of this year's 12 White-winged Crossbills for second highest count for this species. The all-time high count for this species is 30 birds, all of which were also found in the Norfolk circle in 1989. The now third highest count for these crossbills is 8 from 2001. While one of these birds was from the Crawford count, the other seven were from, you guessed it, Norfolk.

Sparrow numbers were mostly lackluster this year. Two Fox Sparrows, one at Branched Oak and one at Ponca, were the only representatives of this species this year. This is the lowest count since two were counted in 2008. Over half of this year's White-crowned Sparrow total of 62 were found in the Scottsbluff circle, but this was the lowest count since 2006 when only 5 were found. Interestingly, this species has never been missed, with the low count of 3 birds occurring in 1991. Harris's Sparrow also had a lower than usual count of 210, which is the lowest since 179 were counted in 2009.

On the positive side, a lone Lark Sparrow was found in the Ames circle. This is the fifth time this species has been found on a Nebraska count and the first find since 3 were found in Grand Island in 1992. The high count for this sparrow is 13 from 1984. The other sparrow bright spot was a record 305 Song Sparrows, 104 of which were found in the DeSoto circle. The old high count of 209 goes back to 1994.

The count of 1689 meadowlarks was good enough for a third place high count, but other Icterid numbers were unremarkable or on the low side. The total of 2361 Red-winged Blackbirds was the lowest since 1298 were found in 2004, and the count of 9 Brown-headed Cowbirds was the lowest since 2008, when only 6 were found.

Last CBC season (2019-20) produced three species of warblers while this year there was only one species of warbler and only four individuals. Single Yellowrumped Warblers were found in the Branched Oak, Calamus, Lake McConaughy and Lower Platte circles. This is the lowest count since 2000 when only three were counted.

To end this discussion on a bright note, Northern Cardinals were found in every circle and gave us a new high total of 1200, beating the old high of 1111 from 2017.
