2021-2022 Christmas Bird Counts

With the addition of the new Fort Niobrara circle, 19 counts were run during the 2021-2022 CBC season. Thirteen of them were run from December 14 through December 21 and the other six were done December 27 or later. The weather was mild to start the count period with almost all water open. As the count period progressed, the weather became more seasonable and much of the standing water froze, but conditions remained fairly benign with the exception of the Lake McConaughy count on January 2. Though it was cold but sunny on that day, the previous day's snow and ice prevented all of the intended participants from the east from coming, and the count was done by two field counters and one feeder watcher. As a result, the McConaughy tally totaled only 50 species while its ten-year average is about 100, and many are McConaughy specialties. So, it is surprising to see that total number of 133 species for all circles is only slightly lower than the ten-year average of 138, and that the total number of individuals (336,111) was the third highest tally, behind only the counts in 1977 (652,936) and 2018 (436,316).

Nine species were found in all circles compared to 21 last year. Twenty-four species were found in only one circle with 15 of those being single birds. New high counts were set by 15 species including a couple of first timers. Single Say's Phoebes were found in the Crawford and Scottsbluff circles with the distinction of being the first flycatchers found on a Nebraska CBC. Just as surprising were the two Pine Warblers found at North Platte and the single found at Harlan County.

Twenty-five species of Anseriformes were found. Geese definitely had a good year and made a big contribution to this year's large number of individuals. Snow Geese were found in 12 circles producing the fourth best count (137,237) and the best number since the high count (308,463) from 1988. The count (2604) of Ross's Geese found with 2156 of those coming from the Lower Platte circle is second only to the count of 6304 tallied in 2016. For the fourth consecutive year, Greater White-fronted Geese set a new high count. The 10,352 birds at DeSoto made up the bulk of this year's total of 10,670 "speckle-bellies", more than tripling last year's count of 3084. The tally of 5456 Cackling Geese came from 15 circles and now stands as the third highest count behind 7689 from 2013 and 6946 from 2010.

Though no scoters or Long-tailed Ducks were found, several duck species were found in notable numbers. A new high count of 285 Northern Shoveler was found. The 207 counted this year in the Lincoln circle equaled the old high count for all circles from 2002. The count of 146 Northern Pintails ties with 2006 for fourth highest count behind the 163 from 2011,162 from 2012, and 157 in 1966. Green-winged Teal set a new high count of 2601. The 2210 found at Harlan County alone would have topped the old high of 1849 from 2019. Hooded Merganser was the only diving duck of note with a new high count of 123 birds, which were found in nine circles. The previous high had been 104 from 2019. Another new high count for water birds was the 16 Eared Grebes, all found at Harlan County, smashing the previous high of 3 from 1997.

Galliformes numbers were unremarkable, except that only five Greater Prairie Chickens were counted with four at Harlan County and a single at Fort Niobrara. This is the lowest number since only three were found in 2001.

While the population of Eurasian Collared-Doves seems to have topped out for now, the White-winged Doves continue to slowly expand their range. This year a total of seven birds were found at Branched Oak, Grand Island, Harlan Co., Lake McConaughy, and North Platte. This is one less than the highest count of eight doves, which were all found at North Platte in 2017. Birds from 16 circles produced a new high count of 691 Mourning Doves, topping the old high count of 612 from 2016.

Other than a lone Wilson's Snipe found at Grand Island, Killdeer was the only shorebird counted this year. The 24 found at Lake McConaughy were the bulk of the record high total of 46 birds for this year, topping the previous high count of 43 in 2012.

Six gull species plus one count week species were tallied, all in unremarkable numbers with the exception of the total of 75 Bonaparte's Gulls, 66 of which were found at Harlan County. This number is a distant second to the high count of 241 at Lake McConaughy in 2003.

Three other swimming birds set new high counts. The four Common Loons counted at Harlan County beat the old high of three from 2010, 1999, and 1998. The Pelicaniformes showed dramatic increases. There were 161 Double-crested Cormorants counted, easily bettering the old high of 43 in 1999. The bulk of them (150) were found at Harlan County, but Ames, Branched Oak, and DeSoto also contributed to the total. Harlan County also had a large proportion (256) of the total 267 American White Pelicans. Pelicans were also found at Ames, Calamus, North Platte and Omaha. The previous high for pelicans had been 26 in 2019.

While all the open water early on in the count period obviously boosted the totals for many of the water birds, they did the opposite for Great Blue Herons. Normally limited to small areas of open water, they were harder to find this season, possibly because of all the open water. This year's total of 12 is the lowest count since 2000 when only nine were counted.

Diurnal raptors were counted in expected numbers, but it is worth mentioning that for the first time, two or more Bald Eagles were found in each of eighteen circles with the lone exception being Crawford. Twenty Merlins were counted in 12 circles, which is second to the count of 26 from 2017.

On the nocturnal raptor side, owls were a mixed bag. The single Snowy Owl found in the Ames circle was the tenth time this species has been recorded on a Nebraska CBC. The high count for this species is 4 from 2011 when two were found at Calamus and singles were found at Lake McConaughy and North Platte.

For the past six years, Barred Owl numbers have been high and consistent, averaging 26, which was this year's tally. The average count was 6 in the 1990s and 15 in the 2000s. However, the only Long-eared Owls were singles found at Harlan County and Norfolk, the lowest count since only one was found in 1998. The only Short-eared Owl this season was one from the Ames circle.

Woodpeckers had a good year with three new high counts. Red-bellied Woodpeckers were found in 14 circles for a total of 680 birds, beating the previous high of 629 from 2017. A total of 699 Downy Woodpeckers were found in all 19 circles besting the old high of 657 from 2011. Sixteen Pileated Woodpeckers were counted in all four Missouri River circles. There was also a count week bird at Ames. The previous high count of 14 occurred in 2018. Northern Flickers were found in eighteen circles with a total of 636 birds, second only to the high count of 665 from 2010.

Two species' CBC numbers have been severely impacted by West Nile virus. Black-billed Magpies remain historically low. Only 22 were tallied this year displacing the 28 from last year for the fourth lowest count. Fortunately, Black-capped Chickadees seem to be doing better. They were counted in all nineteen circles with a total of 1097 birds, which is the highest number since 2012 when 1135 were found.

White-breasted Nuthatch was found in all circles with a new high count of 926 birds passing the old high of 858 from 2006, while Pygmy Nuthatch had the best count (26) since 48 were found in 2013.

Despite reports of low numbers during the breeding season, the Eastern Bluebird number (322) rebounded from last year's count of 167. Sparrow numbers and species were unremarkable with the exception of Fox Sparrows which were found in 11 circles for a new high count of 92, beating the previous high count of 44 from 2012.

Lastly, Icterid numbers had a down year overall. Only 298 meadowlarks were counted for the lowest total since 2008 when only 186 were found. Red-winged Blackbirds totaled 1985, the lowest since 2004 when only 1298 were counted, and finally only 8 Common Grackles were found in just two circles for the lowest count since only 3 were counted in 2005.
