# GOALS for...

## HOG CHOLERA ERADICATION

1

Complete all phases of the cooperative State-Federal Hog Cholera Eradication Program.

2

Stop use of live vaccine.

3

Cholera outbreaks eliminated for one-year period.

4

Require vaccination to be official, and use only killed vaccine.

5

Prohibit importation of all swine vaccinated with modified live vaccine until 42 days after vaccination.

6

Quarantine all imported swine to premises of imported until shipped to slaughter on permit.

7

Comply with all shipping regulations, within the state and between states.

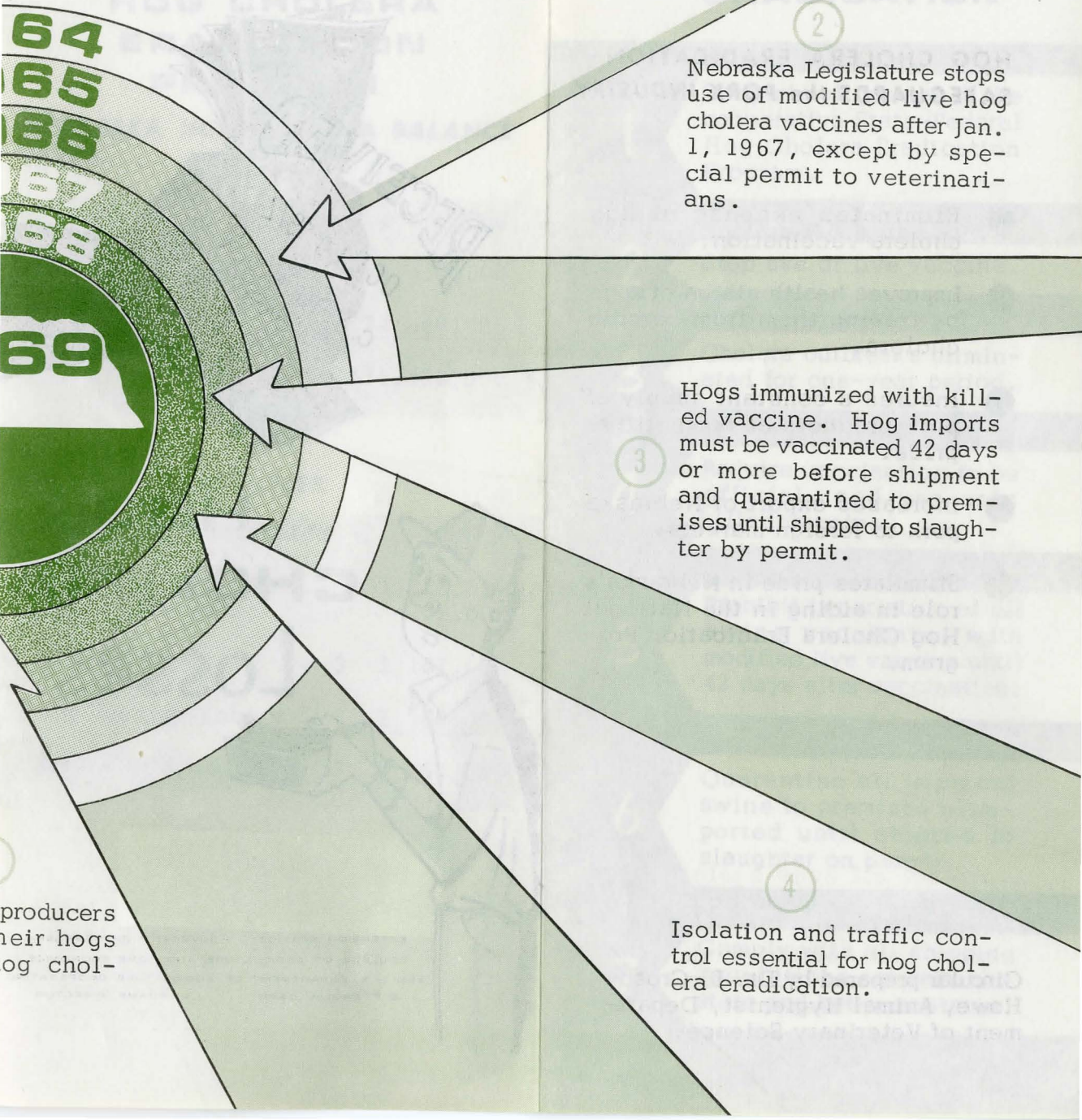

Nebraska Legislature stops use of modified live hog cholera vaccines after Jan. 1, 1967, except by special permit to veterinarians.

3  
Hogs immunized with killed vaccine. Hog imports must be vaccinated 42 days or more before shipment and quarantined to premises until shipped to slaughter by permit.

Isolation and traffic control essential for hog cholera eradication.

# SUMMARY

## **HOG CHOLERA ERADICATION SAFEGUARDS the PORK INDUSTRY**

- Eliminates expense of hog cholera vaccination.
- Improves health status of hogs by freeing them from chronic cholera.
- Insures a constant supply of pork products at competitive price.
- Increases export of Nebraska pork to foreign markets.
- Stimulates pride in Nebraska's role in aiding in the National Hog Cholera Eradication Program.
