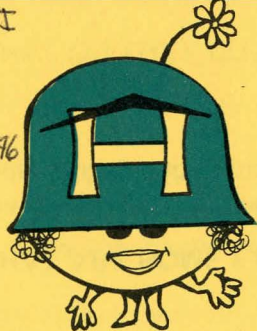

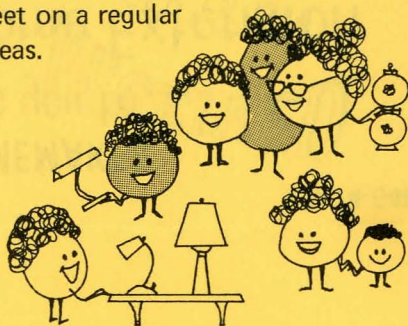

They're groups of homemakers who meet on a regular basis, usually once a month, to share ideas.

WHO CAN BELONG?

YOU CAN — if you're interested in keeping up to date in homemaking information and willing to share with other members the responsibilities of making the club a success.



WHAT DOES IT COST?

Very little! The educational programs you receive in your club are provided by the Cooperative Extension Service free of charge.

Most clubs do have small dues that will help finance the group's activities. But the most important thing is that *Extension Clubs are not expensive!*

HOW CAN I BECOME A HOME EXTENSION CLUB MEMBER?

- Perhaps you're new in the community and don't know many people. Why not contact your local County Extension Office and visit with the county or area Extension home economist. She'll lead you in the right direction.
- What about your friends or acquaintances who are club members? Let them know you'd like to become a member.
- Do you have friends who have similar interests? Perhaps you can be the "sparkplug" in organizing a new group. Your Home Agent will be glad to help you.
