

THE SPRING 1993 OCCURRENCE REPORT

Three hundred one species, plus the possibility that the Traill's Flycatchers reported by Mrs. Ott in Cuming and Lancaster counties included both Alder and Willow Flycatchers, and that the Empidonax sp. included species not specifically reported, were reported from 41 counties. Mrs. Ott is a bird bander, and their official reports continue the Traill's classification, rather than recognizing the split into Alder and Willow Flycatchers.

The symbols used in the table are:

Ja, Fe, Mr, Ap, My, and Je for the months.

- P or p for a species which is present all year, although the same individuals may not be present all year, and the numbers present may vary greatly.

- S or s for a species which remained past Je 30.

W - or w for a species which was present before Ja 1.

The reporters are authorized to use P, S and W in their reports, but where dates are provided and they give the same message (Ja xx and Je xx = P) the dates are given in preference to the symbol. The lower case symbols (p, s, w) are used in counties with infrequent visits to call attention to that fact.

c is shown in the Polk column to indicate records in Clay Co.

Cedar is shown in the Dakota column for a record in Cedar Co., described under Cedar Co.

Dixon is shown in the Dakota column for a record in Dixon Co., described under Dixon Co.

d is shown in the Cuming column to indicate records in Dodge Co.

h is shown in the Perkins column to indicate records in Hooker Co.; in the Howard column to indicate records in Hall Co.

The numbers and "add" in the left columns have no significance other than to identify the lines in the tables.

The counties covered, the number of species reported, and the observers are:

Adams, 40 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, two dates reported: Mr 7 and Ap 10.

Banner, 22 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, two dates reported: Ap 2 and My 14. W. Ross Silcock reported the Green-tailed Towhee on My 1.

Box Butte, 99 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche.

Buffalo, 36 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche. two dates reported: Mr 9 and Ap 9.

Cass, 179 species and the possibility that the Empidonax sp. was one not reported, Gertrude Wood, reporter.

Cedar, one species, shown as a note in Dakota column. Robert Chabane reported a Eurasian Wigeon on Lake Yankton My 10 - 12.

Cherry, 55 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, one date: My 7.

Cheyenne, 90 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, three dates reported: Mr 21, Ap 29, and My 27.

Clay, 9 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, 100+ members of American Birding Association, one date reported: Mr 7, shown as "c" in the Polk Co. column..

Cuming, 66 species, and the possibility that one of the Traill's Flycatchers reported My 28 - 31 by Mrs. Ott was an Alder, Larry Einemann and Mabel Ott, reporters, Craig, Morelle, and Sandra Herzinger. Thirty-one observations in northern Dodge Co. My 30 by Larry Einemann are shown in this column as "d"..

Custer, 32 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, one date reported: Ap 9..

Dakota, 200 species, and the possibility that the Dowitcher sp. was a Long-billed, Bill Huser, reporter, Teri Dolezal, Jerry Probst, and participants from the NOU Annual Meeting. See Cedar Co., above, for comment on that note. A Yellow-rumped Warbler (Audubon race) was seen Ja 1.

Dawes, 147 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche.

Dawson, 20 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, three dates reported: Mr 5, Ap 9 and 11.

Dixon, one species, shown as a note in the Dakota column. Jan and Richard Johnson had a Black-throated Sparrow at their feeder in Wakefield from Ja 2 to early March.

Dodge, 31 species, Larry Einemann, reporter, one date reported: My 30. These are shown in the Cuming Co. column as "d".

Douglas, includes Sarpy, which see.

Deuel, 89 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, four dates reported: Mr 21, Ap 29, My 27 and 28..

Frontier, 18 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, two dates: Ap 11 and 12. Mr. Rosche commented that there was a large roost, containing about 110 birds, near Curtis, and they saw an almost complete albino Cliff Swallow My 28,.

Garden, 113 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, Bruce L. and Donna J. Walgren, first date reported Mr 4.

Gosper, 39 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, two dates reported, Mr 5 and Ap 11.

Grant, 85 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, three dates reported: Mr 27, Ap 8, and My 7.

Hall, 72 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche and 100+ members of American Birding Association. Mr 8 observations in Howard Co. are shown as "h". The Bewick's Wren responded to a tape of Screech-Owl calls played by B. J. Rose.

Hamilton, 41 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, two dates reported: Mr 6 and Ap 10.

Howard, 5 species, shown as "h" in the Hall Co. column, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Alice McKale, Catherine Mueller, Dorothy J. Rosche, Mary Saville, Gail Seamans.

Hooker, 12 species, shown as "h" in the Perkins Co. column, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, one date, Ap 8.

Kearney, 47 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, four dates reported: Mr 5, Ap 9, 10, and 11.

Keith, 161 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Alice McKale, Catherine Mueller, Dorothy J. Rosche, Mary Saville, Gail Seamans, Bruce L. and Donna J. Walgren. Mr. Rosche commented that this is only the second spring in 24 years that he has seen a Surf Scoter in Nebraska; the other was in 1990. The bird had the characteristic whitish patches on the sides of the head, a darker cap on the head. When it was scared by a passing boater the wings showed totally dark all over.

Kimball, 10 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, two dates reported: Ja 3 and My 14. W. Ross Silcock reported the Mountain Plover and the Green-tailed Towhee on My 1.

Lancaster, 193 species, and the possibility that the Dowitcher sp. was a Short-billed, that the Traill's Flycatchers reported by Mrs. Ott included both Willow and Alder Flycatchers, and that the Empidonax sp. included one or more not otherwise listed, Larry Einemann, Thomas E. Labedz, and Mabel Ott, reporters.

Lincoln, 147 species, Richard C. Rosche and Wilma Wyman, reporters, Harry Golden, Catherine Mueller, Alice McKale, Dorothy J. Rosche, Mary Saville, Gail Seamans, and all members of the Tout Bird Club. A Summer Tanager was reported on July 1. Mr. Rosche commented: this is his second spring record of a White-winged Scoter in Nebraska; the other was a wintering individual that remained in Keith Co. in the spring of 1985. This was a full adult male, black all over except for the characteristic white patch in the eye region. The orange bill possessed a dark knob at its base.

Morrill, 115 species, Alice Kenitz and Richard C. Rosche, reporters, Dorothy J. Rosche. The Trumpeter Swans had yellow neck bands, indicating that they originated from LaCreek NWR, in Bennett Co., SD.

Perkins, 61? species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche, three dates reported: Mr 20, Ap 30, and My 28. Ap 8 observations in Hooker Co. are shown as "h".

E. g. all woodpeckers, notably Flickers and Downies, Eastern Kingbirds, Song Sparrows, Warbling Vireos were notably scarce. Dickcissels came very late, but seem to be abundant again after a few years of scarcity. The Great Horned Owl I recorded was observed on a nest for six successive weekends. By the time I found the nest, the nestling was already good-size and active.

Sarpy (includes Douglas), 192 species and the possibility that the Empidonax sp. was one not reported, R. G. Cortelyou, Larry Einemann, Ruth Green, Clyde Johnson, Babs and Loren Padelford, reporters, Dot Duda, Diane Guinn, Craig Hensley, Emma Johnson, Neal Ratzlaff, Alice Rushton, Kathleen Rose, Julie Schroeder, Jerry Toll, Steve Workman. One of the two swans seen on Cunningham Lake had an orange marker on the right wing.

Scotts Bluff, 163 species, Alice Kenitz and Richard C. Rosche, reporters, Sue Amiotte, Felix and Lucy Koenig, Brad McKinney, Dorothy J. Rosche, Nora Mae Vance.

Sheridan, 162 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Sheila Orr, Dorothy J. Rosche, Bruce L. and Donna J. Walgren. The two Tree Swallows Mr 27 were the earliest Mr. Rosche had had in Nebraska.

Sioux, 114 species, Richard C. Rosche, reporter, Dorothy J. Rosche. Six dates reported: Fe 19, Ap 2, 22, and 23, and My 11 and 16.

Thomas, 134 species, Tanya Bray, reporter, Duane Bright. Mrs. Bray was at the National Forest headquarters Ja 23 - 25, Ap 2 - 5, and My, 7 on.

The following comments were taken from Mr. Rosche's comments on central and western Nebraska for *American Birds*:

Common Loons were generally scarce this year and in small numbers. Greater White-fronted Geese were unusually common and widespread. On the ABA meeting field trips March 9 - 12 to the Rainwater Basin area south of Grand Island, many Ross' Geese were seen in with the thousands of Snow Geese. Every large group of Snows that could be seen reasonably well with a scope contained Ross'. Cinnamon Teal were unusually more common, widespread, and earlier. Red-breasted Mergansers were unusually more common and widespread. Northern Bobwhites were much more common and noticeable in both the North and South Platte valleys, extending into Colorado. Sandhill Cranes were much more abundant and widespread. Black Terns were very scarce. Pinyon Jays were very scarce in the Pine Ridge. Red-breasted Nuthatches were more common than usual all spring.

NOTES ON BIRD SIGHTINGS IN NEBRASKA

Black-bellied Whistling Ducks. On Wednesday, May 26, 1993, at 7:00 a.m., we saw two of these birds at our house in rural Lancaster Co., south of Denton, NE (S 26 T-9-N R-5-E). The ducks flew across part of the pond and perched in a dead cedar for about ten minutes before flying off in a southwesterly direction. The distinctive coloration, including black underparts, gray head, bright beak, and pink legs were readily visible. As the birds were flying, the large white areas on the tops of the wings were also clearly discernible.

Gyr Falcon. On May 10, 1993, I observed a large hawk over one of our large local basins. It had very wide and pointed wings, and flew very low and fast. After a couple of turns around and over the basin, it landed on a brush pile close by. At this range I could see that it was a Gyr Falcon.

It was uniformly gray with no dark helmet such as a Peregrine Falcon has. I watched it for several minutes before I left. I did not see it again although I did look for it the following day, and occasionally later.

We watched it for about five minutes, and noted its large size compared to the House Wren, and that it was gray on top, and white on the breast and belly. A third observer was Laurine Blankenau.

White-eyed Vireos and Summer Tanagers. On June 16, 1993, Dick Rasmussen and I were birding in the Nebraska National Forest, near Halsey in Thomas Co., when we heard and soon spotted a breeding pair of Summer Tanagers. They were in a cottonwood tree in plain view along the Middle Loup River adjacent to the tennis courts. In the same area we heard a pair of White-eyed Vireos calling from a dense thicket. I later spotted one of these vireos. These two species are normally not found this far west.

Summer Tanagers. I was teaching a class at Neale Woods [on the north edge of Omaha in Douglas Co.] on May 7, 1993, when a male Summer Tanager chose to perch on a bare branch near my banding nets. A day or so later, Dot Duda found a female at her home that had flown into a grill and killeed itself. Neal Ratzlaff found Summer Tanagers on May 6, 1993, just west of Fort Calhoun [in Washington Co.].

Summer Tanagers. On May 20, 1993, Mike Gutzmer, Chuck Chase, and I observed two (possibly three) males at Indian Cave State Park, Section 6, Township 63 North, Range 17 East, Richardson Co., NE. The birds were approximately 200-300 meters [about the same in yards] apart along the paved road in small, isolated trees. The area around the small trees is mown, but the border of the deciduous forest is only 20-30 meters from the road edge.

Lazuli Bunting. On May 5, 1993, Craig Hensley, Program Director at Fontenelle Forest, saw one bird on the south end of the Marsh. He was the first to see and report this western species, which is seldom seen here, and it was a "lifer" for him.

Notes on Waterfowl and Shorebirds by Lee Morris, Benedict, NE, May 1, 1993. "Birding has been exceptionally good for these two groups since our basins are so full this spring. There are more **Canvasbacks** and **Goldeneyes** than I've seen in years; two flocks of **Hudsonian Godwits** in the last week, the first time I've seen any of that species in years; so far, one **White-faced Ibis** and one **Cattle Egret**." [R. G. Cortelyou reported that Lee Morris saw **Buff-breasted Sandpipers** on May 15, 1993.]

Notes on Warblers during the spring of 1993 by Ruth Green, Bellevue, NE. "**Golden-wing, Kentucky, Connecticut, Mourning, Pine, and Worm-eating Warblers** were reported by several birders from Fontenelle Forest or Neale Woods. The Boardwalk at Fontenelle Forest was the 'hot spot' for **Blackburnian, Chestnut-sided, and Bay-breasted Warblers**; they were seen there for a week or more. I have never had as many **Hooded Warblers** reported as this year." Ruth wrote that she and Shelley Bonsall saw three males at the same time along the railroad tracks in Fontenelle Forest, and, on the same day, another was seen from the Boardwalk, while Gertrude Wood had one at her home in Elmwood. Nesting warblers were also present in Fontenelle Forest according to Ruth, including **Ceruleans, Parulas, and Prothonotaries**.

BALD EAGLES NEST AT NORTH PLATTE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

The refuge, located in Scotts Bluff County, played host during the summer of 1993 to one of only two bald-eagle nests in Nebraska, and three eaglets were reared to flight stage. A successful nest on the Middle Loup River in 1992 was the first bald-eagle nest to fledge in Nebraska in over 100 years. [See NBR 60 (2): 59. June 1992.]

The nest was discovered on April 2 while I was inspecting an abandoned heron/cormorant rookery. A startled adult bald eagle leaped out of one of the larger nests and began making several treetop-level passes and snapping its beak over the intruder. Staff members Felix and Lucy Koenig began to make casual observations of the area during routine, biweekly wildlife surveys. Lucy relocated the nest from afar, using a spotting scope, and witnessed the first hatchling on May 5.

A vantage point was selected 1/4 mile from the nest, and an observation blind was erected. During subsequent visits to the blind, a second and then a third (May 13) eaglet were confirmed by Mrs. Koenig. We knew that there would be anxious days ahead prior to any young leaving the nest; usually only one eaglet is produced from a successful nest. The biggest risks facing the three eaglets until flight stage would be sibling rivalry and high winds. It seemed unreasonably optimistic to expect all three eaglets to fledge.

The adult eagles proved to be exceptional parents. We were able to watch them bring ducks and carp to the nest and share in the feeding responsibilities. During most of May and June, there was never a time when at least one adult was not at the nest, tending to or merely watching over their brood.

The first eaglet fledged July 15 and the last took flight July 20. During an inspection of the area beneath the nest shortly afterwards, we found a variety of food remnants: over 60 carp carcasses, numerous waterfowl parts, one cottontail leg, and a pocket-gopher skull. All three young and both adults were seen in the area of the nest up to September 1, when the observation blind was dismantled.

The Panhandle of Nebraska is very fortunate to have bald eagles nesting so early in their comeback to this state. It is a positive indication of the continuing health of the eagle population, as well as a tribute to the bountiful wildlife habitat found in the North Platte River valley. Refuge staff will be spending several anxious months ahead in anticipation of the adult eagles returning to nest again in 1994.

Editor's Note: In addition to the three eaglets mentioned in the above article, three eaglets fledged in 1993 in a nest along the Middle Loup River northwest of Grand Island. This is the same nest where two eaglets fledged in 1992.

WHOOPIING CRANE SIGHTINGS DURING SPRING MIGRATION, 1993

A total of 136 whooping cranes began the migration from Aransas National Wildlife Refuge in the spring of 1993, and all the cranes had left by April 26. The migration proceeded rapidly, with no major storms within the flyway. The first dates for confirmed observations of migrating cranes were April 2 in the U.S. and April 5 in Canada. The last sighting date was June 2 in Saskatchewan, Canada. Sightings were reported from Texas (1), Oklahoma (1), Kansas (7), Nebraska (8), South Dakota (3), North Dakota (2), and Saskatchewan, Canada (22). The longest stopover time was a juvenile, migrating alone, which stopped in central Kansas for 14 days. There were 14 cranes on a small wetland playa in central Kansas, a new record for size of a migration group in the U.S. By early June, 42 nests had been located on the northern breeding grounds.
