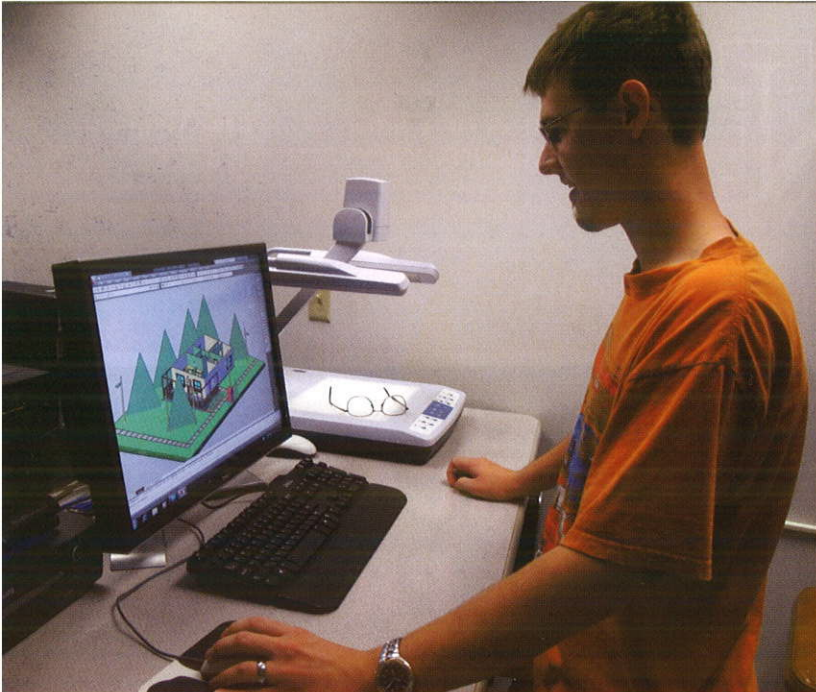
## The Best of Both Worlds

Students will complete coursework already part of the ALEC successful teacher education program  
Community college students will have hands-on learning, thanks to access to current technology relevant to a variety of disciplines







Students will spend their first two years at the state community college of their choice and their third and fourth years at the University of Nebraska–Lincoln.

Students successfully completing a two-year community college program will receive an Associate of Applied Science degree

Students successfully completing the two-year teaching education program at UNL will earn a Bachelor of Science degree in agricultural education, as well as a professional endorsement and certification to teach skilled and technical sciences in middle schools and high schools

Students who attend Southeast community college have the option of living on the University of Nebraska–Lincoln Campus

### **Wanted: Teachers with Leading-Edge Technology Experience**
