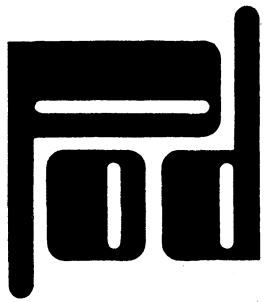

LIVING AND LEARNING IN ACADEMIC CULTURES

An Invitation to Attend the Annual Conference of
the Professional and Organizational Development
Network in Higher Education

October 22-24, 1981 -- Westin Hotel, Cincinnati

If you've never heard of "POD," the Professional and Organizational Development Network in Higher Education, you've been missing something important. Six years ago POD was formed to provide connections between faculty, administrators and project directors who were involved in what was, at that time, the burgeoning new movement of faculty development. Since 1975, the annual conference of the network has become the most important meeting place for those interested in the renewal of higher education through more effective teaching and learning and more sensitive organizational strategies.

Sessions at the POD conference are noted for three things: the presenters are practitioners of the latest approaches to instructional and institutional improvement; workshop formats actively engage all participants; and, because of both the conference structure and the educational and personal commitment of the members, the level of personal contact and camaraderie is unusually high.

This year's program includes over 30 workshops on topics ranging from departmental self-study and renewal, gender issues in the classroom, application of developmental theory to adults of all ages and consulting strategies for change agents to discussions of major curricular issues and opportunities for the exchange of problems and procedures for solutions in liberal arts colleges, graduate and professional schools and large, multi-purpose institutions. There are sessions on applying educational research to educational reform at the college level, and on the transfer of training and evaluation strategies from business to academe.

The conference will begin with a grand simulation of an academic community that will explore some of the experiential issues in institutional renewal. Friday morning sessions will survey the past, present and future of professional development, and the conference format will encourage interaction in small groups and personal reflection on learning that can be transferred to action back home.

A pre-conference workshop for those interested in the Birkman method of individual assessment for improved work life is scheduled for Thursday morning and early afternoon, October 22. Those wishing detailed information should contact the conference director immediately.

Main conference sessions begin on Thursday, October 22, at 3:00 p.m.; registration is open at noon on Thursday. The conference will conclude by 3:30 p.m. on Saturday, October 24. Transportation is easily available from the Cincinnati airport -- details on hotel accommodations (at reduced conference rates), the meal plan and transportation details will be sent upon receipt of registration.

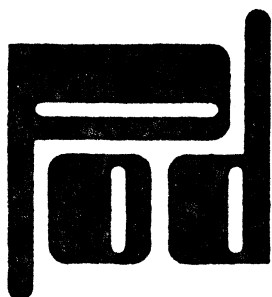
Note that there is a \$10 discount for registrations made by September 15. Deadline for guarantee of the discount hotel rate is September 22.
